As a result of the interview and interrogation of the observers named in para 6b, it is my opinion that an unusual flying object was seen by both men. There was no indication that either party possessed a high degree of imagination or tendency to exaggerate or fabricate the data submitted. Due to the unexpected appearance of the object(s) and the short time observed, the accuracy of the descriptive data is somewhat questionable. b. Preliminary investigation with AAS and Control Tower agencies gave no indication that the observation made was caused by scheduled aircraft or weather phenomena.
