No Report In File		11. COMMENTS Analysis of returned Form 164 indicates sighting probably caused by reflection from high-flying a/c. Form 164 description differ from that of initial report. Object round, silver, about size of large a/c. Appeared like a mirror reflecting sun rays. Traveling at 600-800 MPH at about 30,000 ft altitude from SE to N. Observed 3-5 mins & disappeared behind trees near observer. Sighting evaluated as probable a/c.
