On August 27, 1958 - while vacationing at our summer home located in East Derrying N.H. - my family and I decided to go to an auction to be held in Dunbarton (see enclosed bulletin). Our home is located high amongst the rolling hills of this area - elevation estimated at 1100 ft.

After lunch we drove upgrade and along the ridge line of a large hill mass - then the road turns sharply to the left - here for about 200 yds the grade of descent is very steep - about 40° from horizontal. Off to our right the hill falls away to expose a beautiful view (Birds-eye) of $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ miles in width. Bordered with a heavy

tree line on the far side - rolling hills and a view of a distant Lake. (Lake Horace)

It is customary for me to always look at this vista and comment about it. As a side note - One Sunday after Mass we returned

from Hillsboro N.H. along a road that runs through the defile, and I observed an Air Force plane flying overhead - I'd guess he was at 500 ft more or less - It appeared to me at the time, that as he was lower than the hilly country side, that it was strictly a pleasure hop (a Sunday driver pilot). Twenty minutes or so later, when we reached the spot of our ^{later} observation I was amazed to see that this plane was still in the confines of the valley area, and that we - in the car were higher than they in the plane. It was a thrill for me, as I've always considered myself a "frustrated" pilot. Incidentally, I have flown light planes (Piper + Aerovue).

Getting back to the date in question - as I turned the car to the left about to descend the steep hill (low gear after a stop - as the road is (or was) and one has to give right of way to any car fighting to climb the upgrade, one of my youngsters said "look - look - what is that?" I stopped and we all instantly saw the same thing - "what is it Daddy" - Look Look - what is it? One would say "It looks like a flying saucer - then more scrutiny - remarks were fast coming - no wings - no tail - it's going to crash - I'm scared etc etc. After it had passed from view - right front to front, behind or through tree tops, I asked each one in turn - "what did you see" not offering any comments or suggestions.

The conclusion ^{were} unanimous - "like two saucers, one on top of the other but upside down - no wings - no tail - no smoke - no windows - color - reddish-orange. Remember we were looking down on this object and could see the entire outline, both in diameter and side view.

(CONT'D)

I was so amazed at the spectacle, that I sat there for several minutes - to assure myself that it could not have been an apparition - and that I wanted to ~~to~~ impress this vision on my mind in the event - that if and as I expect the object crashed in the wood land - that upon its discovery and revealing by its finders or other watchers, that I could tell of its movement, as I saw them. Then we proceeded to the auction -

On our return, I inquired of several farmer + country friends if they had heard any reports of strange craft or a crash - No one had - and when I told my version - they like all normal people, would look askance and say nothing - I believe to them, I am respected for my intelligence and personal dignity.

I made these same remarks to a few other close friends - but they (as you the reader of this note) what can be said? I decided to say no more - hoping that during the coming Bird + Deer hunting season, that hunters would come upon the wreckage (if any) in the woods - nothing has been reported to my knowledge, so I've said little more to anyone.

Let me state here emphatically that I certify that what I declare I saw, I really did see, and no one - I repeat, no one, can change my opinion - If it was not a secret weapon of our country - it was a ~~foreign~~ foreign

based object.

It appeared to me to be either control landing or a
skim glide of a metal object, that could have burnt up
coming through outer space and was gliding to a crash.

I request that if your office is interested - I would be
glad - especially when the foliage is out - to have an Air
Force representative meet me, and I will show the locale,
direction of flight - altitude - point of loss of vision - and if
it were necessary or thought desirable, we could by radio
have a light recon plane ^{or} copter fly over the course.

I realize now, the effect of the time loss, but one does
not enjoy sounding fantastic - and it wasn't until we saw the
movie of Unidentifiable Flying Objects, that our thoughts along this
line were brought back, and Mrs ~~_____~~ (my wife) thought we
should tell of this experience.

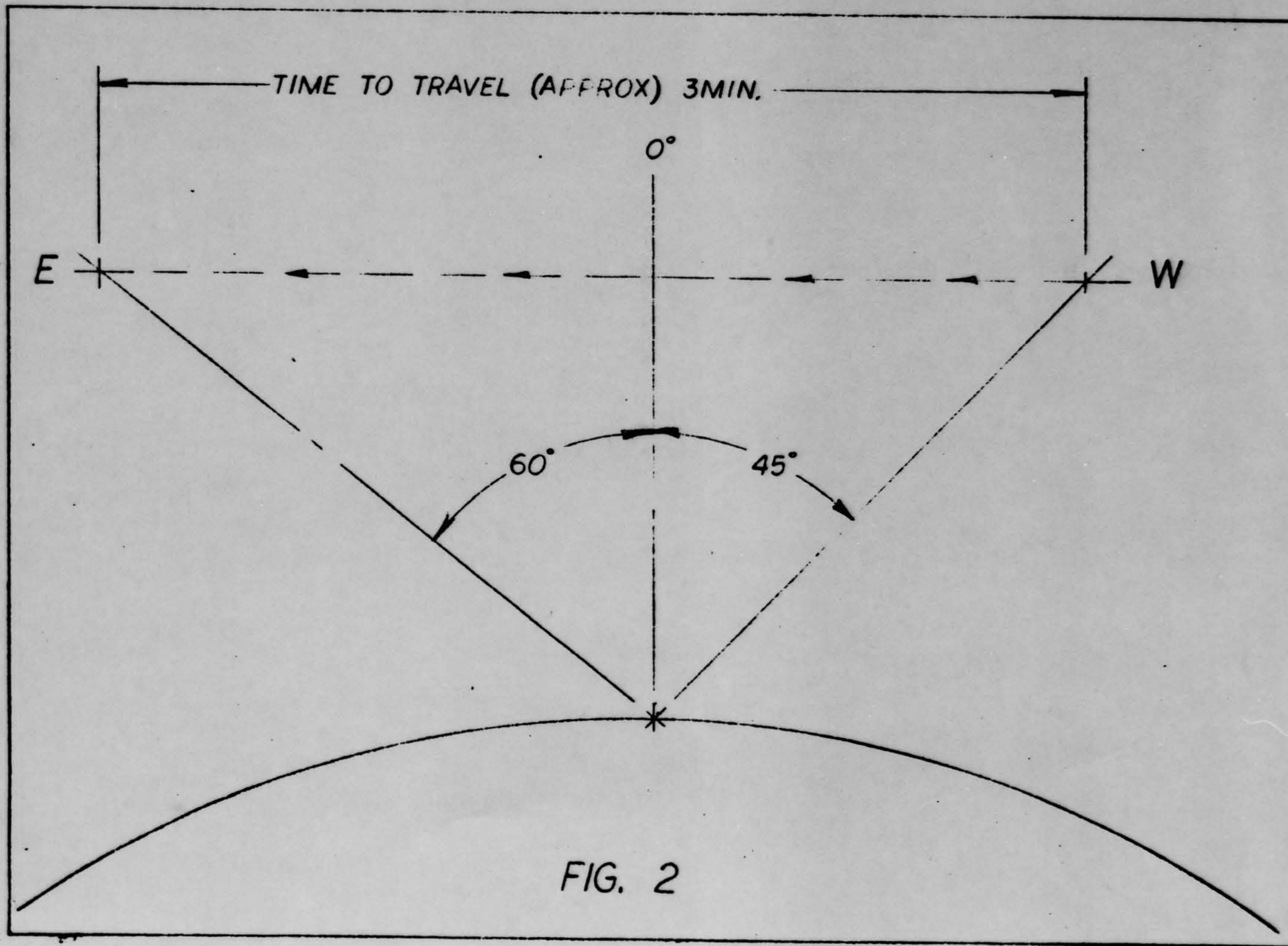
