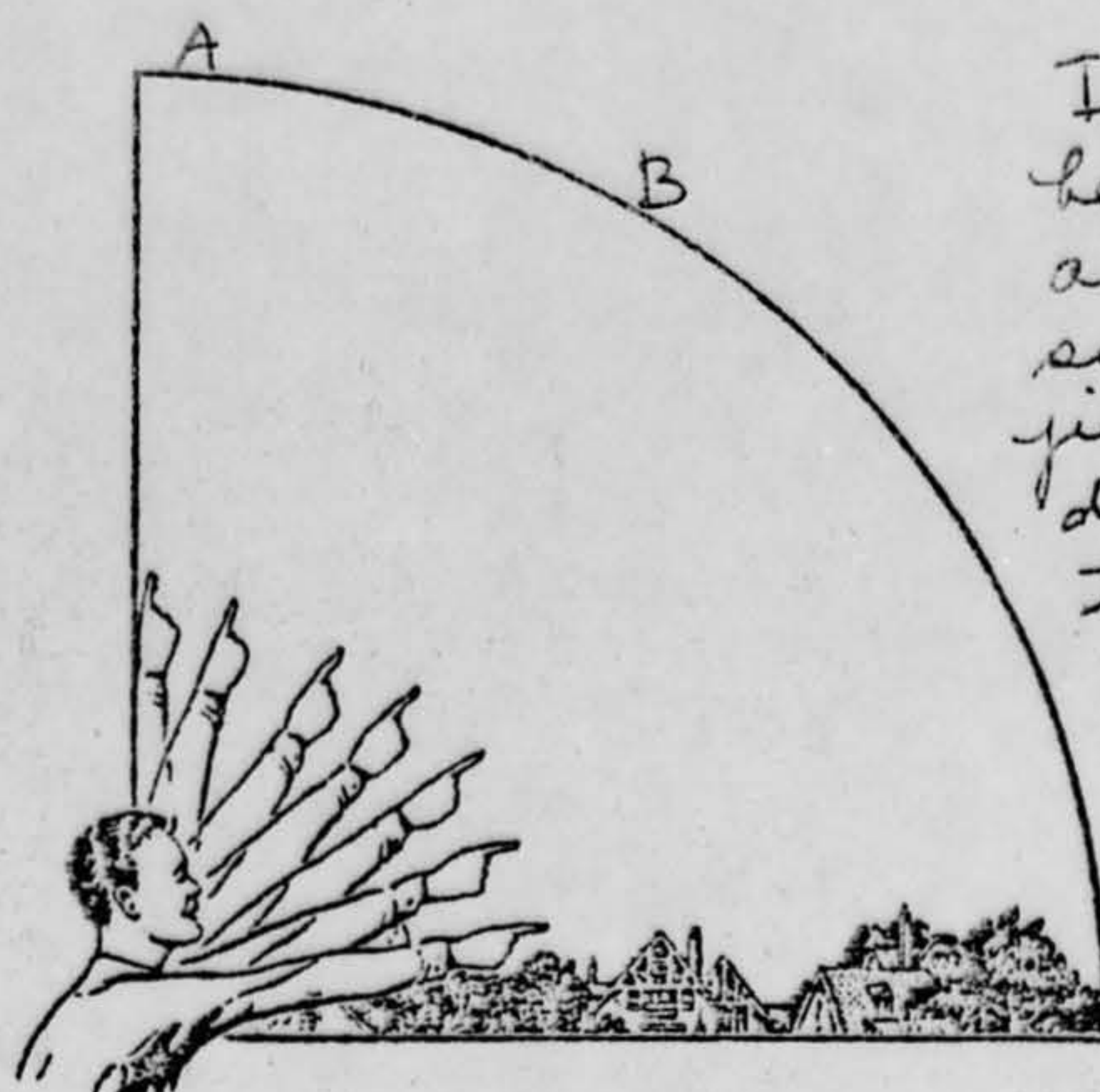

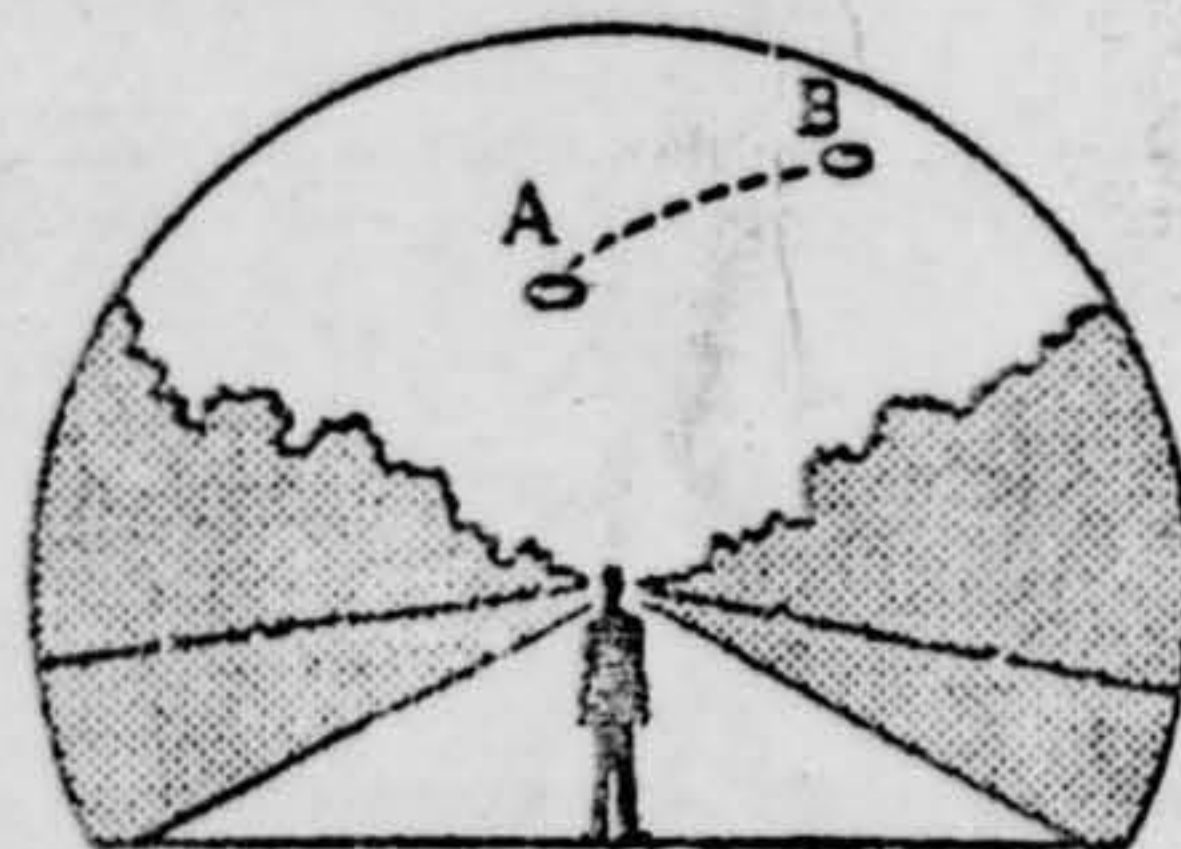
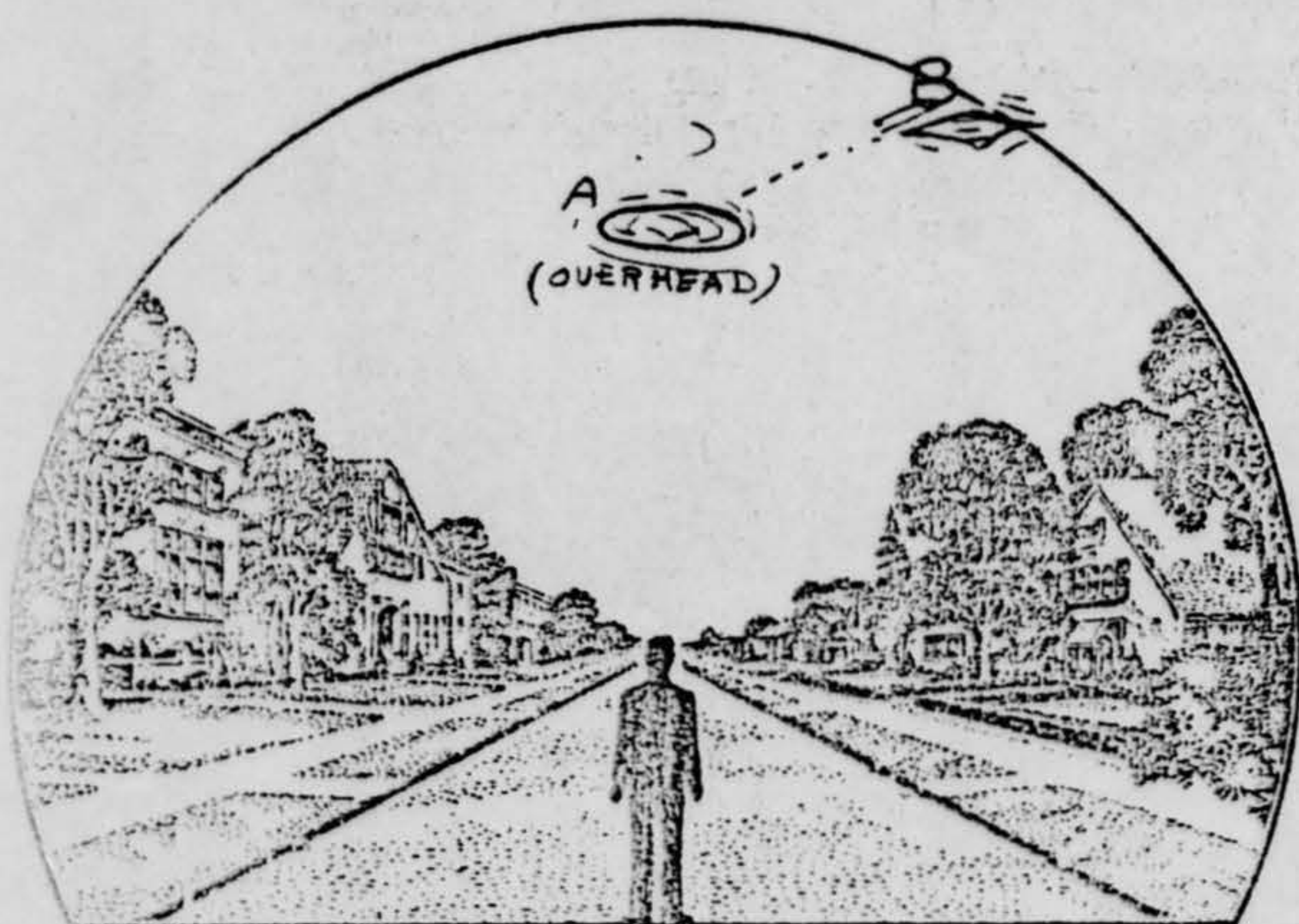

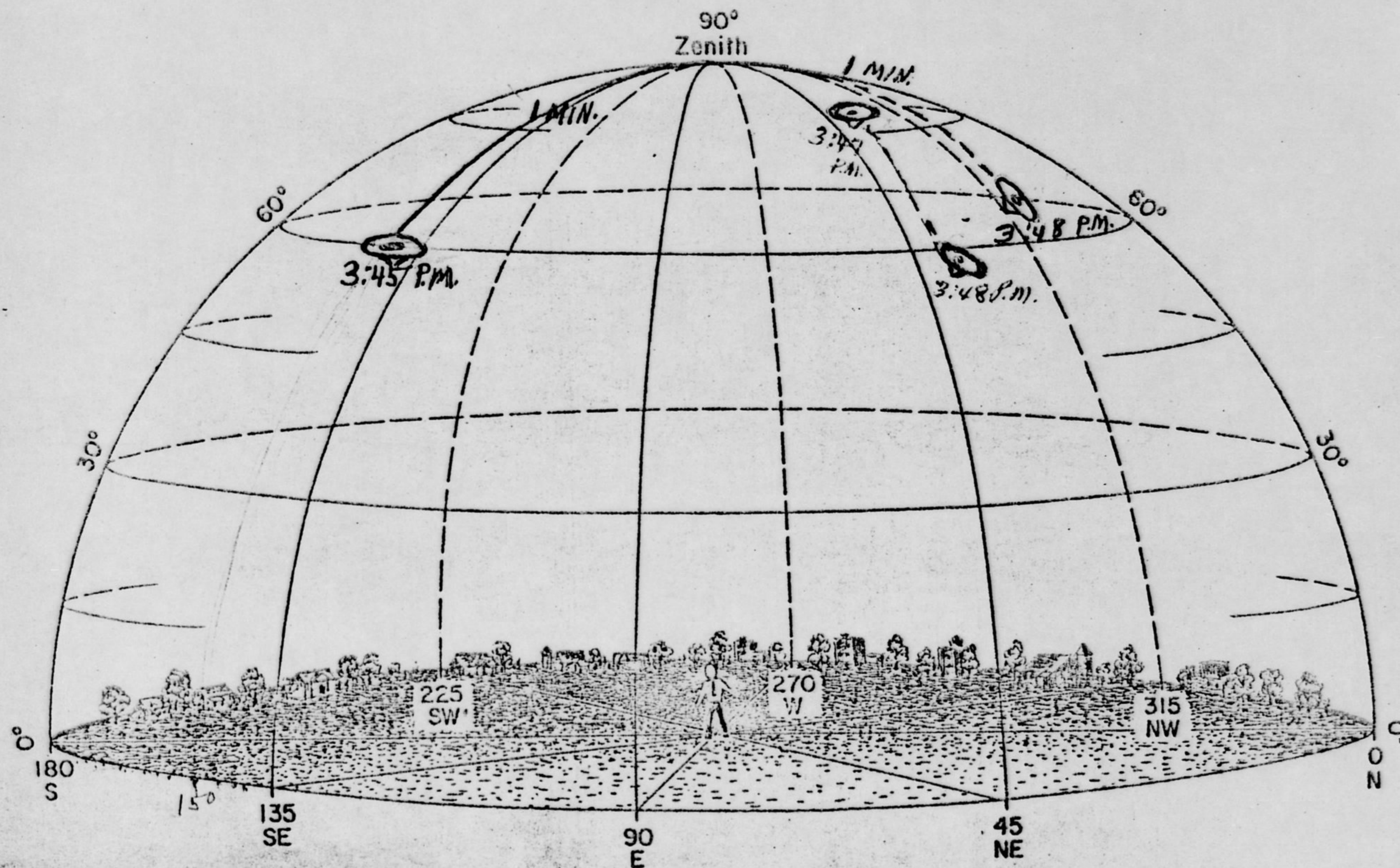
We were in the backyard and were looking up at a low-flying airplane when we noticed way overhead this metallic, shiny object which came out of the southeast and disappeared in three minutes in the northwest. It rotated in a straight path, and then I noticed a second one only when the first tipped on its side and veered off to the northwest. They disappeared very suddenly together. There was no sound; it was a very sunny, clear day, no wind. I estimate they were very high, and yet, we

could see the whirling, or rotating motion, as it went steadily on. As it rotated, it reflected the bright sun, and "sparkled". Three other persons viewed these objects with me... ~~_____~~ + ~~_____~~ (ages 10 & 7) and ~~_____~~ ~~_____~~ (age 7). They all have the same descriptions. The centers were thicker than the edges.

They were clear to me, and to the children, and not fuzzy. I wish I could remember the direction of the rotation, but can't. (I think clockwise, but am not sure)

They resembled 50¢ pieces, tops, spinning records with a funnel through the hole, compacts with a "bump", or saucers. Take your pick. Of course, the angle viewed "changed" the total appearance. The rotating motion, & quick disappearance, are the two things that impressed me most.

I've never put too much faith in these reportings before, but am not a "doubting Thomas" any more!
