AN UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECT WAS SIGHTED LAST NIGHT OVER THE SAN FERNANDO VALLEY, SANTA ANA, CALIF., AND SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS.

THE FIRST REPORTED SIGHTING WAS MADE BY MOONWATCHERS AT TRINITY UNIVERSITY IN SAN ANTONIO. [REDACTED] HEAD OF THE TEAM, SAID THERE WERE NO U.S. SATELLITES DUE OVER THE AREA WHEN THE OBJECT WAS SEEN. THE TEAM DID NOT BELIEVE IT WAS A METEOR.

AT LEAST A DOZEN PERSONS REPORTED SEEING AN OBJECT IN THE SKY OVER CALIFORNIA AROUND 8:30 P.M.

[REDACTED] AN ENGINEER, DESCRIBED IT AS "AN ENORMOUS GLOWING THING ARCHING ACROSS THE SKY FROM HORIZON TO HORIZON."

U.S. AIR FORCE OFFICIALS IN WASHINGTON SAID THEIR EARLY EARLY EARNING RADAR NETWORK HAD NO REPORTS OF AN OBJECT IN THE SKY.

THE REPORT FROM SAN ANTONIO SAID THE OBJECT APPEARED IN THE NORTH SKY AND WAS MOVING SOUTHWEST TO NORTHEAST. NO ESTIMATE OF SPEED WAS GIVEN.

[REDACTED] A REPORTER ON THE SANTA ANA REGISTER, SAID IT APPEARED TO MAINTAIN A CONSTANT VELOCITY AND WAS VISIBLE FOR ABOUT FIVE MINUTES.

"IT WAS ROUND AND SEEMED TO WINK LIKE A STAR," HE SAID.

MEMORANDUM:

Called Mr [REDACTED] San Antonio Moonwatch team head, who also works in the TV control room of a local TV station. He did not see the object in question, and referred me to Mr [REDACTED] the only witness. Mr [REDACTED] stated, upon being contacted, that he has been on the moonwatch team since the first Sputnik went up. He is a physicist in the Trinity University. He stated that he was in his house and one of his children was outside. The child ran in and cried that there was a satellite going over. Mrs [REDACTED] looked at the clock and it showed 1910 hours. Mr [REDACTED] went outside and he looked at about 280 deg at elev of 35 deg and saw an object yellowish-white in color that appeared to be 5 times the size of Venus with naked eye. He said that it appeared to be larger than Sputnik I, but traveled across the sky at the same speed. There were trees to the NW of the observer and the object went behind the trees. The object could still be seen through the branches, and when it was about 5 deg above horizon it seemed to curve to the right. The object disappeared at about 350 degrees just above horizon. It was viewed for 3 minutes. Mr [REDACTED] said that he discussed this sighting with other moonwatch officials and they said the curve he saw was natural for a satellite. He said this curve was the only reason he thought it was something out of the ordinary.

This sighting occurred the 18 September 1960.
