I am a City Patrolman - Lansing Police Dept - Craig Cobb
 Officer Valdez and I were on our way to my home
 after he relieved me. at 3:34 we seen an object
 apparently, burn up as it entered the atmosphere in a
 northerly direction - a few minutes later at 3:48 AM
 I was putting my dog out and as I looked into the
 pre dawn sky I observed a blue green flashing
 light - it seemed to be traveling from South to
 North and flashing about every 5 seconds - there
 was only darkness between flashes - no noise at all.
 I watched the flashing light for a time and then ran
 into the house to get my Binoculars - I called the
 State Patrol Dispatcher also and returned to the yard
 to find that I could not relocate the light.

SIRS,

I AM A CITY PATROLMAN HERE IN CRAIG COLORADO IN THE COUNTY OF MOFFAT,
I WAS COMEING HOME FROM DUTY AT 3.34 AM ON THE MORNING OF JULY 29 1963
AND SEEN AN OBJECT BURN UP UPON ENTERING THE ATMOSPHERE, WHILE TRAVELING
IN A NORTHERLY DIRECTION. THE FLAMES WERE BLUEISH GREEN AND VERY BRIGHT.
I MADE NOTE OF THE TIME, IN THE EVENT THAT A FIRE MIGHT FOLLOW IN ONE
OF THE SURROUNDING NATIONAL FORRESTS... OR IN THE EVENT OF A MISSING
PLANE& SO ON.

AT 3.48AM I WAS PUTTING MY DOG OUT AND AS I STOOD LOOKING INTO THE
PRE-DAWN SKY I OBSERVED AN OBJECT OR RATHER THE FLASHING LIGHT FROM
AN OBJECT ALMOST DIRECTLY OVER HEAD AND TRAVELING IN A NORTHERLY
DIRECTION. THE LIGHT WAS A BLUE OR BLUE GREEN COLOR AND VERY DEFINATELY
FLASHING. I WOULD GUESS ABOUT EVERY 5 SECONDS, I WATCHED THE LIGHT
FOR A COUPLE OF MINUTES AND THEN WENT INSIDE TO GET MY BINOCULARS,
WHEN I RETURNED I COULD NOT RELOCATE THE OBJECT.

I BELIEVE THE OBJECT TO BE A SATELLITE IN ORBIT, AS IT LOOKS MUCH
THE SAME AS THE OTHERS DID EXCEPT INSTEAD OF BEING A STEADY WHITE
LIGHT FLOATING ALONG, THIS IS A PULSATING OR FLASHING LIGHT THAT
BREAKS THE DARKNESS EVERY 5 SECONDS OR SO AND IS APPEARANTLY BLUE
IN COLR OR .

I INTEND THIS REPORT TO BE HELPFUL AND DONOT WANT IT TO BE TAKEN
AS A FLYING SAUCER OR HOAX REPORT.
I SHALL CONTINUE TO WATCH FOR THIS LIGHT AND MAKE NOTE OF THE
TIME AND DIRECTION OF TRAVEL, UNTILL I HEAR FROM YOU.

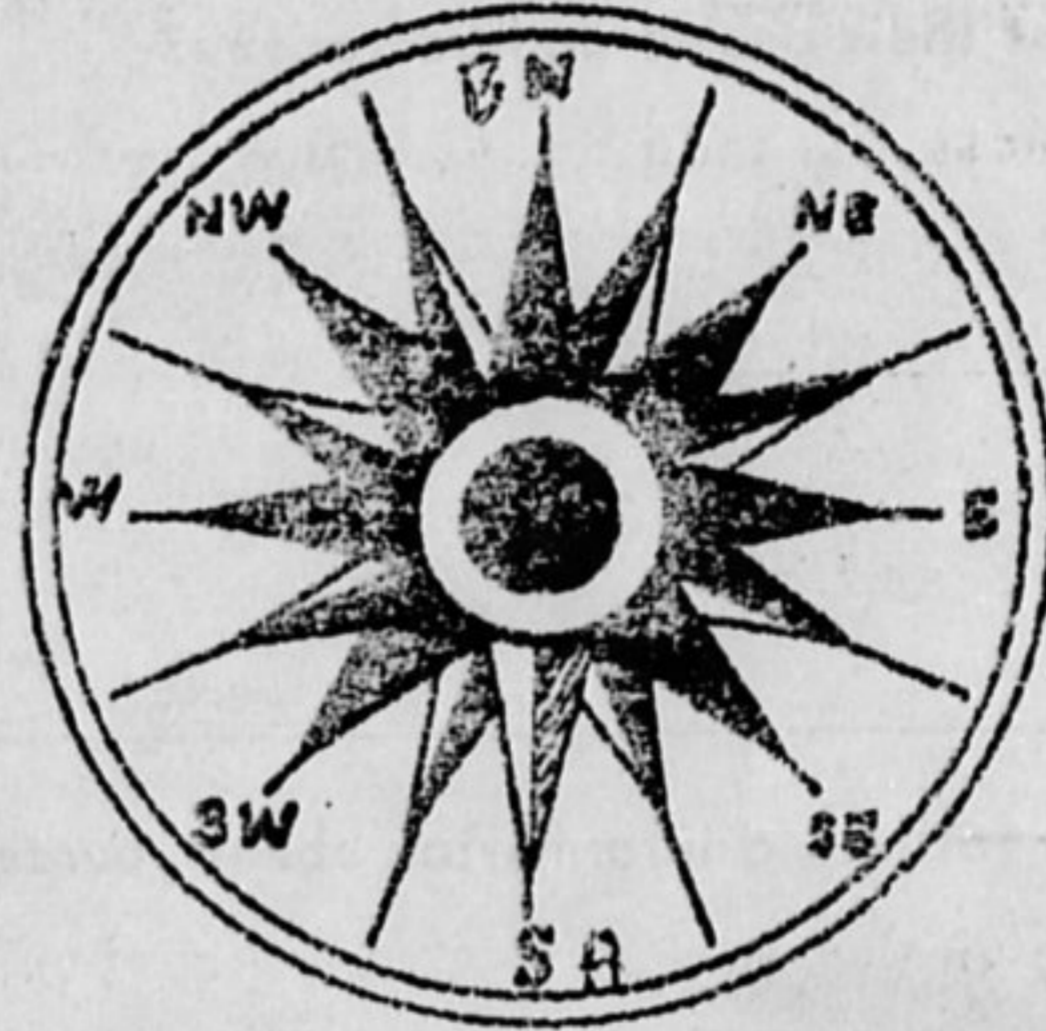
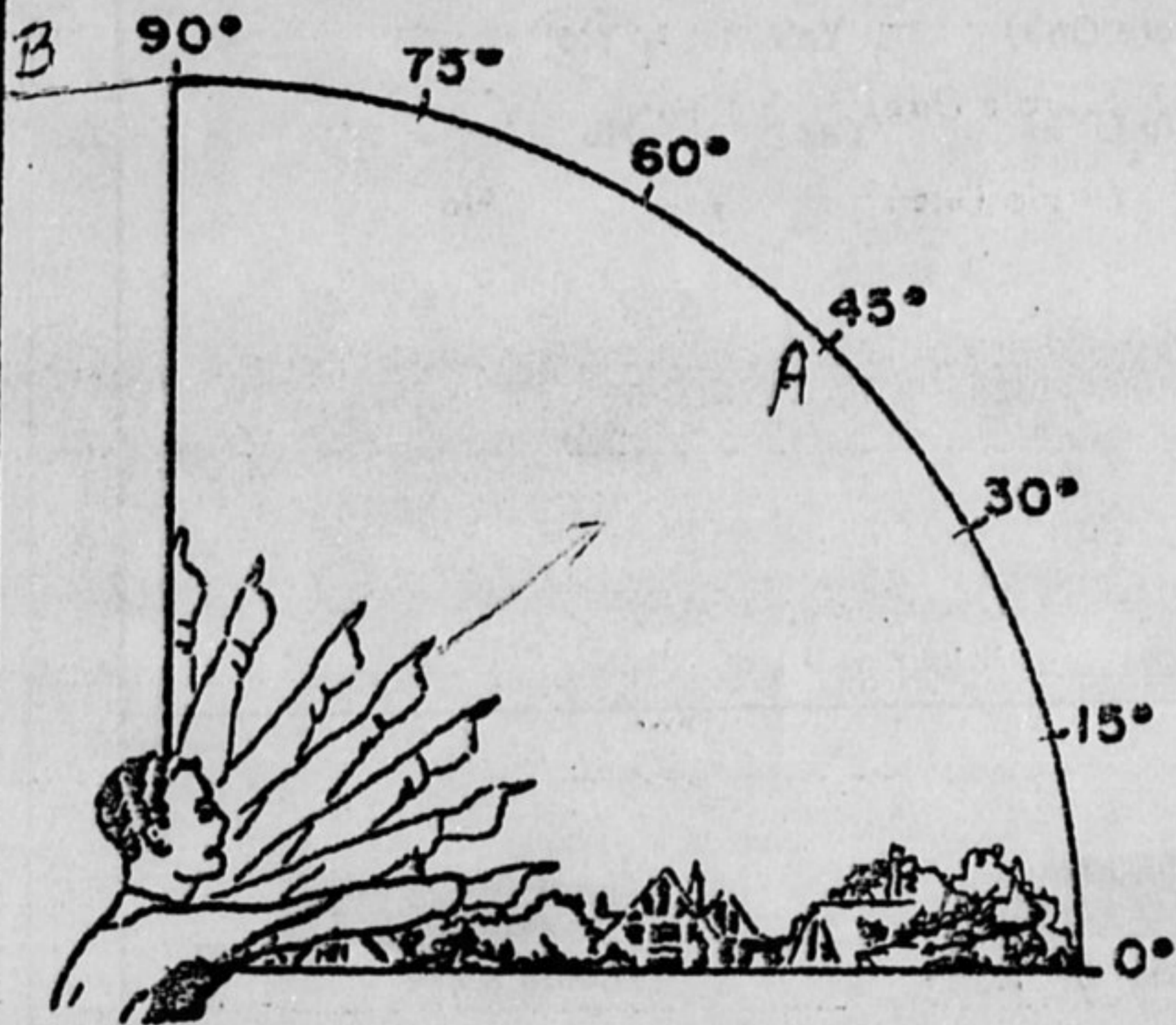
