Northbrook Aviator Explains Those 'Mysterious' Lights

"Strange lights" reportedly seen last week in several sections of Illinois were an electric advertising sign behind a plane, says the Northbrook pilot who flew the craft.

Robert Burmeister, 1705 Happ road, said he was pulling the sign, which has 350 light bulbs, over the areas where the lights were seen.

"Unless the viewer is directly beneath it, the sign appears to be a series of rolling lights because the message is flashed across the sign," the pilot said. Mr. Bur-

meister, an employee of Priester Aviation Company, Pal-Waukee Airport, Wheeling, said the sign reads, "You Can Learn To Fly in One Week—Priester Aviation—Lehigh 7-1200." George Priester is owner of the airport and the aviation company.

Mr. Burmeister said reports of "unidentified flying objects" have been received before in areas over which he made night flights with the sign.

Dr. Allen J. Hynek, director of Northwestern University's Dearborn Observatory, supported Mr. Burmeister's statements.

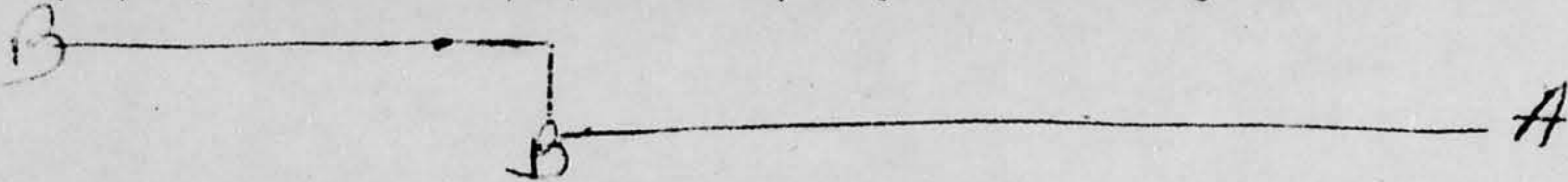

After the flying object had ascended it floated or sailed, much faster than it had when first sighted. My daughter and I seem to agree that in hovering almost to a stand-still that this vapor-like object had lost its strength and was either seeking energy or trying to generate power; and as soon as it had gained more power from what we do not know, then it was able to ascend and speed up. In all other accounts when people have been chased there seemed to have been metal (or with a car). Perhaps this object needed such an attraction this particular night to gain the desired height and speed. It could not have been seen by anybody other than persons living along our alley, until it received this sudden boost which allowed it to rise above the third floor level, after it had left our alley. When I looked at the clock (after the object was out of sight it was 9:40) five minutes had passed. I then decided to see if this vapor had caused a reaction on the surrounding things.

When I looked at the moon which was bright and full that night, I didn't see a moon but a beautiful ornate cross with a trail of light extending downward. There was a blaze of light behind it but no moon. The lines of the cross were prominent, the light was behind the cross and it was a bright yellow.

This lasted a while and then disappeared. The moon was seen again but it seemed to be transparent and a much paler yellow than before. It didn't affect the stars. It was about a half hour later before we saw any air-

planes and they were flying very high and at a distance. The near by fields reported no airplanes enroute at the time we called about the mysterious vapor.
