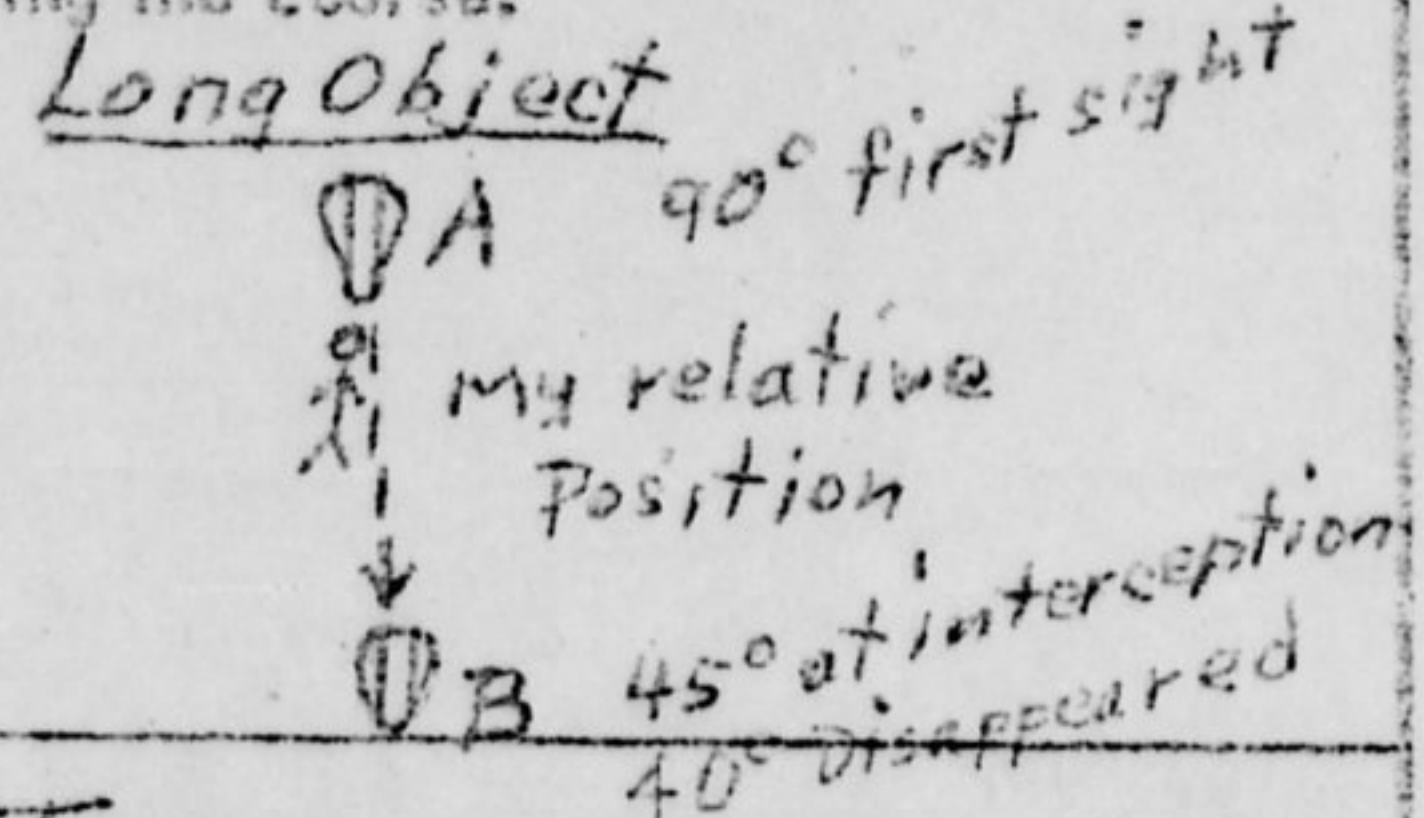

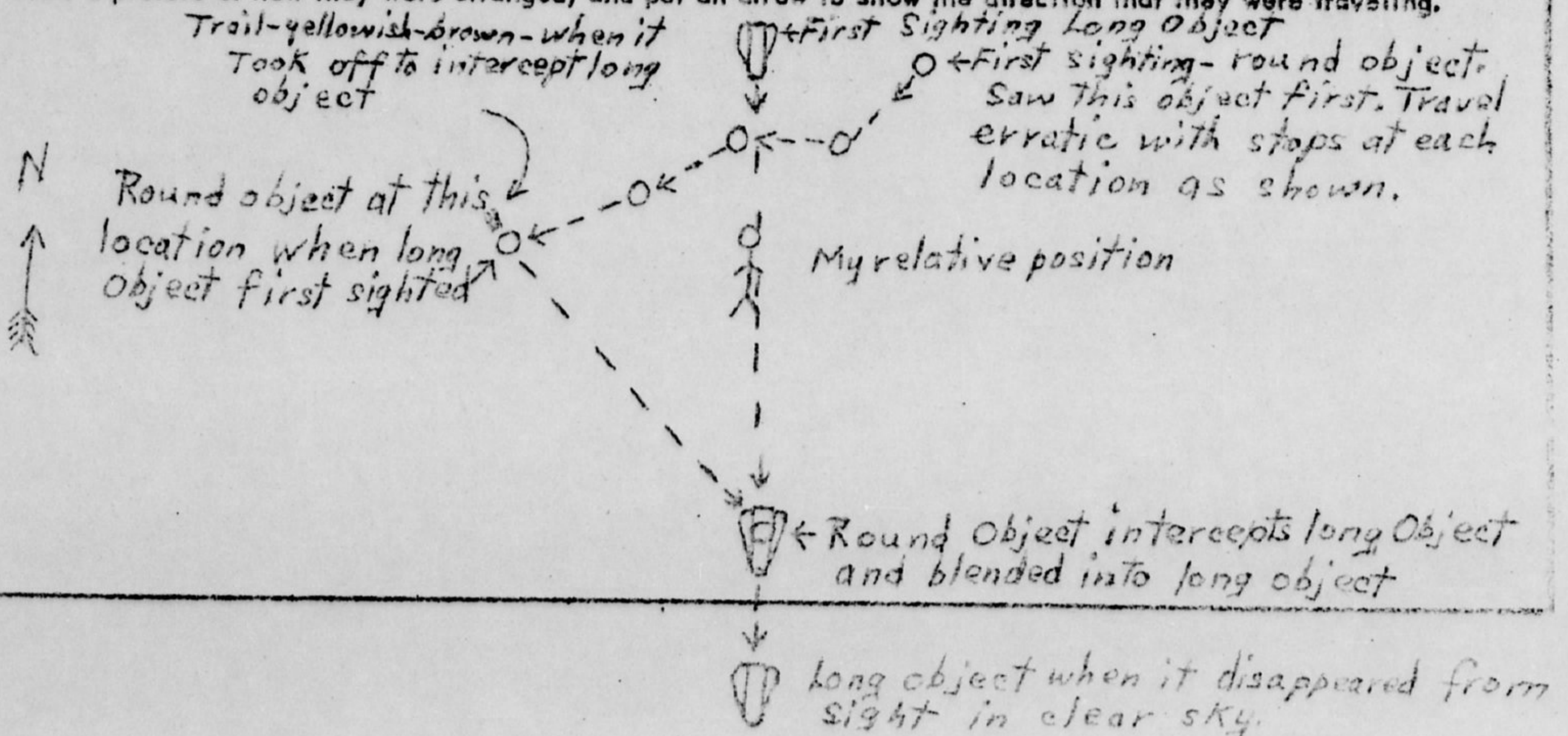

35. Information which you feel pertinent and which is not adequately covered in the specific points of the questionnaire or a narrative explanation of your sighting.

1. When I first sighted the round object that it was a toy balloon, except it did not have any appendage below it. Was a perfect sphere. Sun was at back and could plainly see form was a sphere. Its erratic moving, changing directions and stopping made me realize upper air currents would not normally move a balloon in such manner - movements were too fast and too definite in direction changes.
2. After going over my head, asked my foster son if he "could see anything up there" and pointed in westerly direction - He said "yes - its round" and immediately added - "There's a long one." I picked up the long object just as he made the statement. Was positive from this that he saw exactly the same objects I was looking at.
3. After the long object had disappeared I told him they were UFO's. He wanted to know what "UFO's" meant so explained them to him. After this short explanation I thought to look at my watch. It was 1535. From this I estimated I had explained UFO's for about 5 minutes and that the sightings had lasted approximately 10 minutes prior to their disappearance.
4. When round object moved at terrific speed to intercept long object I asked my boy, and I also, to listen very carefully for any sound. Neither of us heard anything.

5. When first sighted the movements of the round object gave the definite impression that it was waiting for, or looking for, something. Appeared to be a "rendezvous" as after the long object came into sight and passed shortly southward from the overhead position the round object seemed to spot it and took off like a shot to make the interception. I watched very carefully to see whether the round object would pass the long object, but it did not. It looked as though the round object had attached itself to the long object but could not tell whether such attachment actually occurred or whether the round object was above or below the long object.

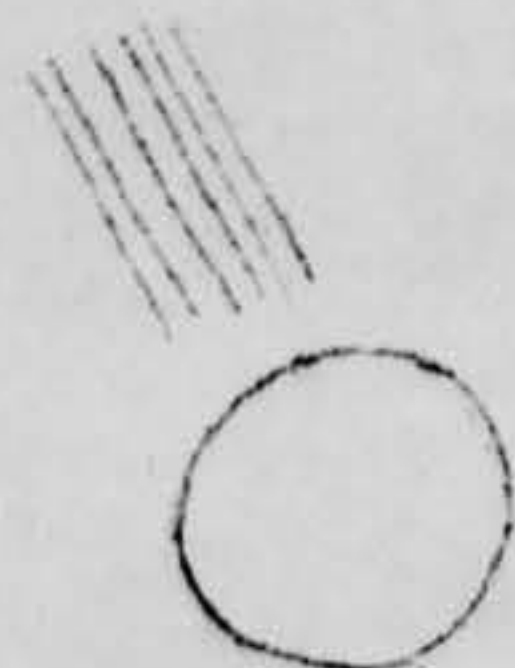
