Distance to object being the only point of data conflicting. Distance to object observed from speeding car through windows could have been misinterpreted by the witness. All other data presented indicates that the object was or could have been an a/c. Case carried as an a/c sighting.		

✓ In the case of 12 February in Germantown, Ohio, was there only one observer? If so, I would be inclined to think that he was confused by a reflection from or through the car window. If he saw it from three to five minutes and wasn't curious enough to stop at the side of the road and get out to look, I don't think much of him as an observer.

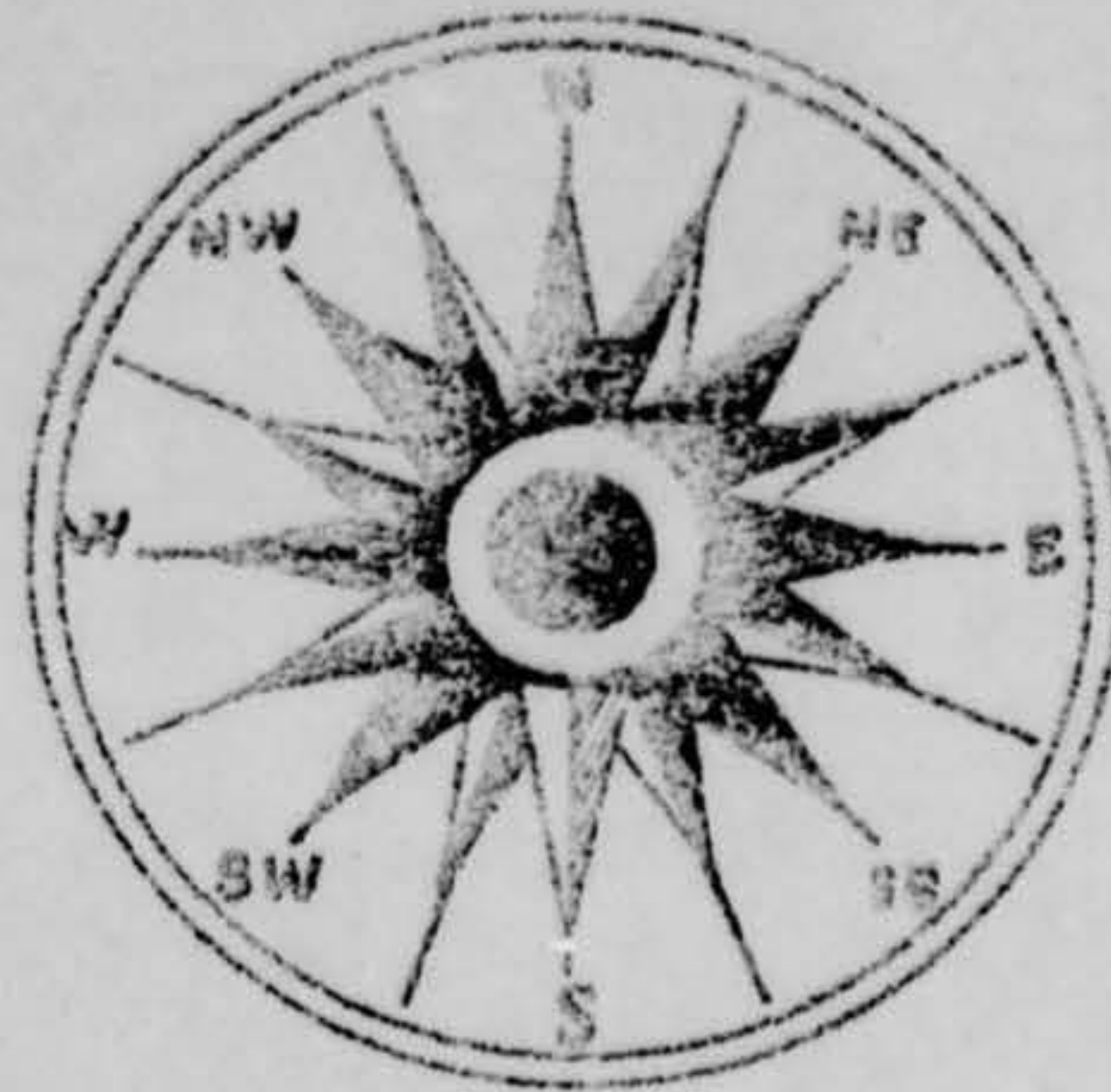
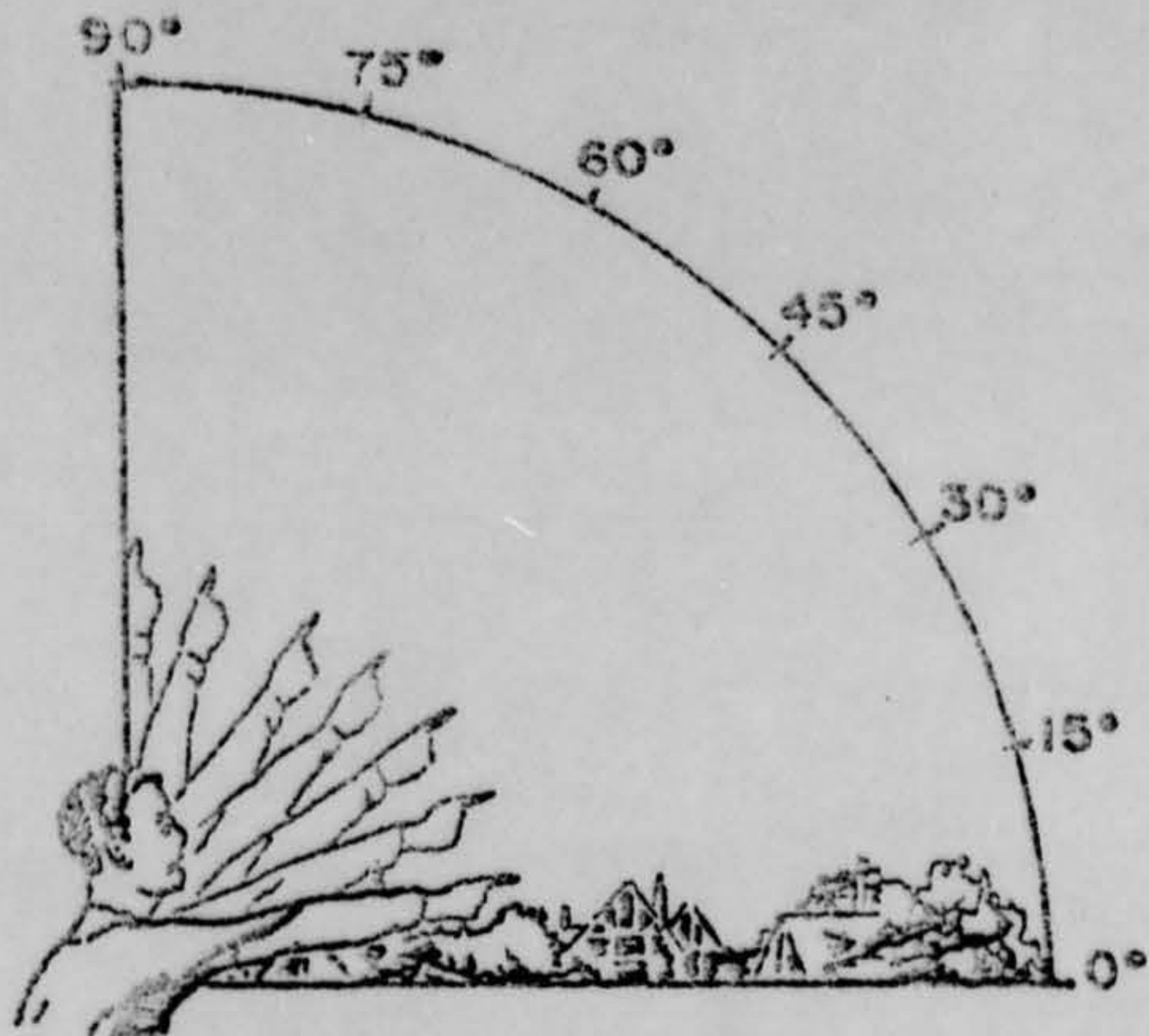
