1. Reference letter, Hq Foreign Technology Division, Air Force Systems Command, TDEW, 8 Sep 1965, Subject: UFO Sightings, Early August, Missouri and Kansas.

2. Airman [REDACTED] who reported an UFO incident on 12 August to the 29th NORAD Region has been separated from the United States Air Force. However, three other witnesses to the incident have been contacted.

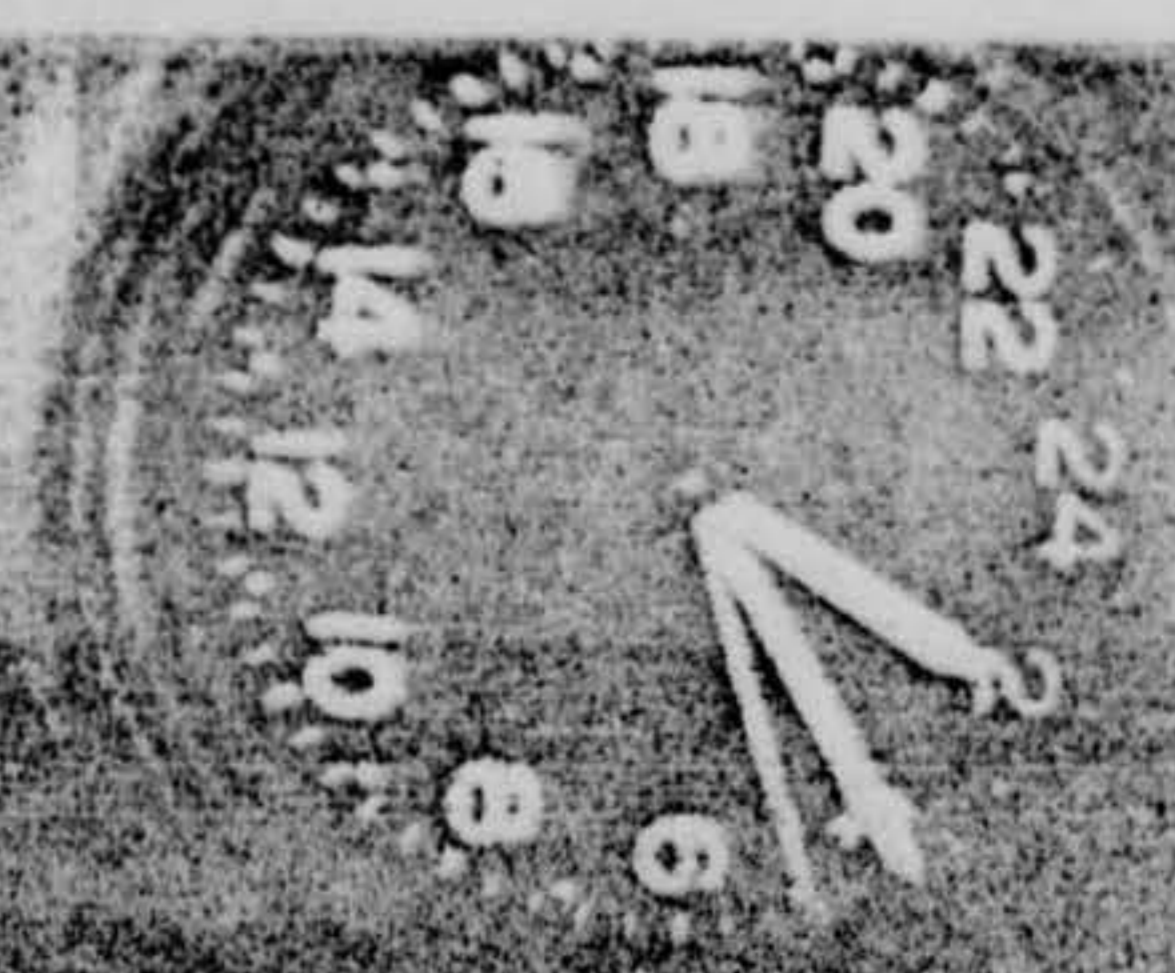
3. In compliance with paragraph 14, AFR 200-2, the following data is submitted:

a. Description of the Object:

- (1) Varied in shape from round to oval; starlike.
- (2) The size was estimated as that of a pea.
- (3) The objects varied in color and appeared to change color from white, rouge red, blue, green, white.
- (4) Witnesses differed. One witness saw only one object. Two witnesses saw from 3 to 5, one of which was oval in shape and remained a dull red color.
- (5) No definite formation but objects appeared to be randomly scattered in a small pattern.
- (6) No trails were observed.
- (7) The objects made no sound audible to the observers.

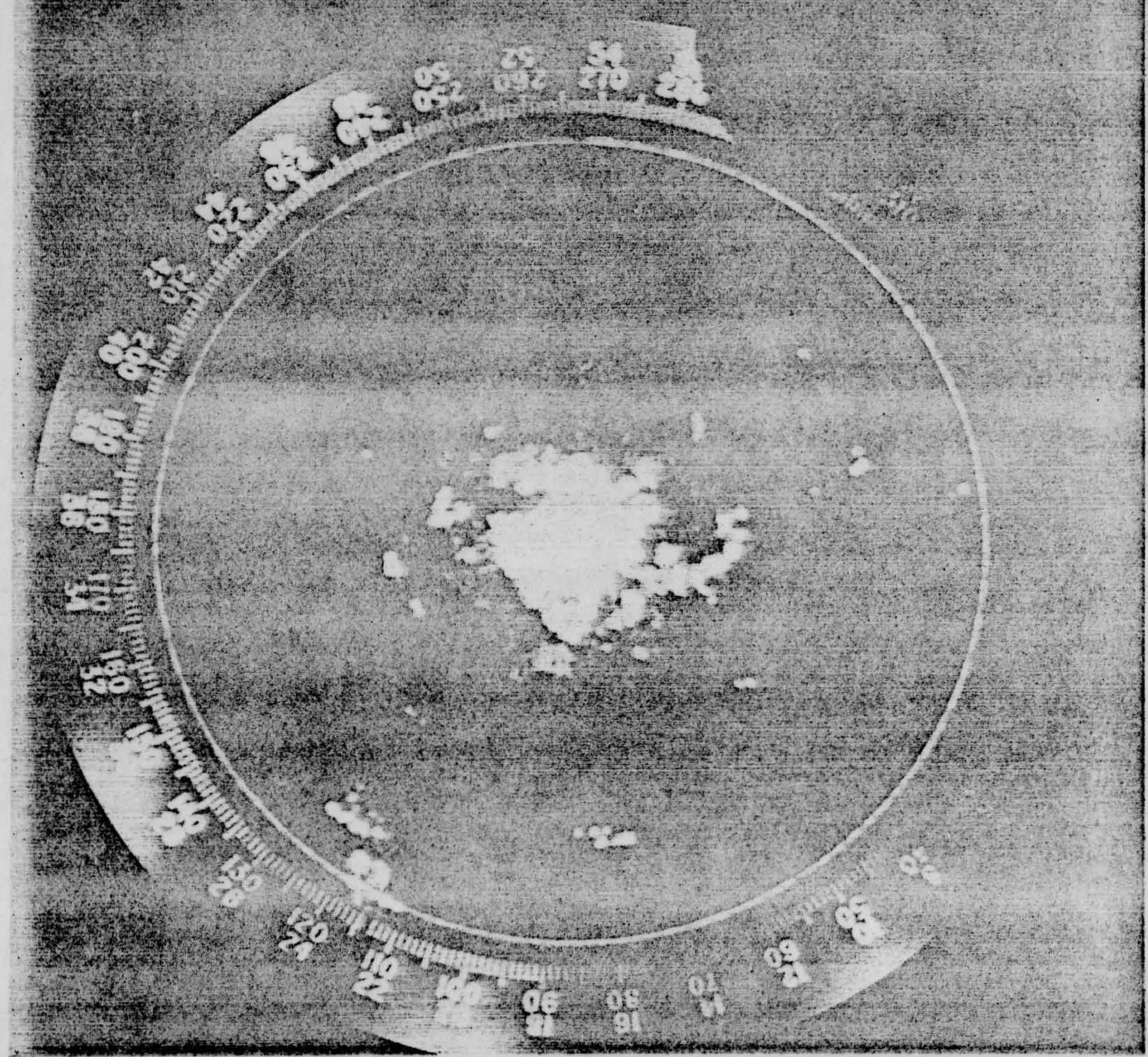
b. Description of Course:

- (1) The objects were called to the attention of the available witnesses by the control tower operator who has been separated from the service.
- (2) The objects were initially observed in an east-northeast direction from the base operations building at Whiteman Air Force Base.



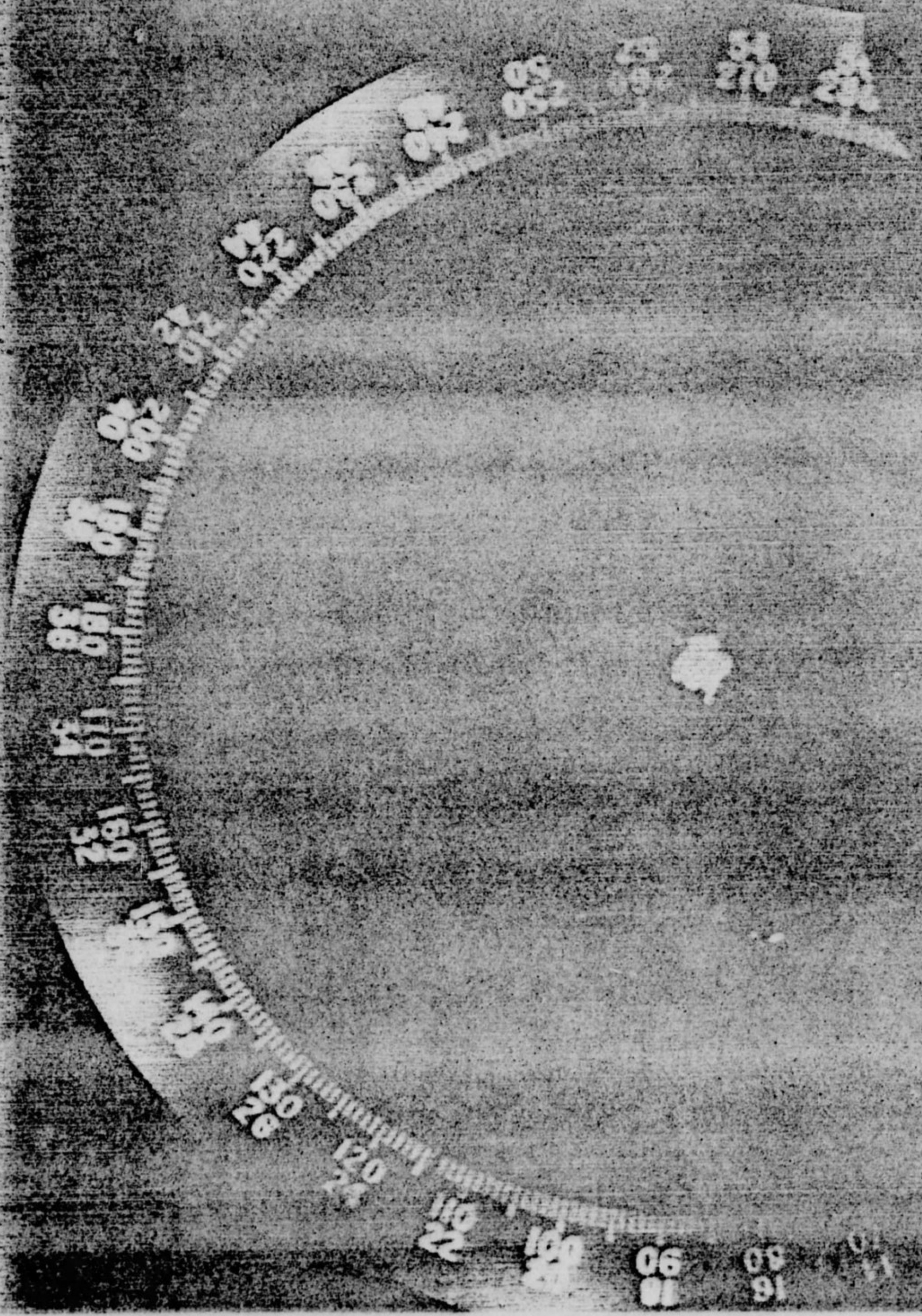
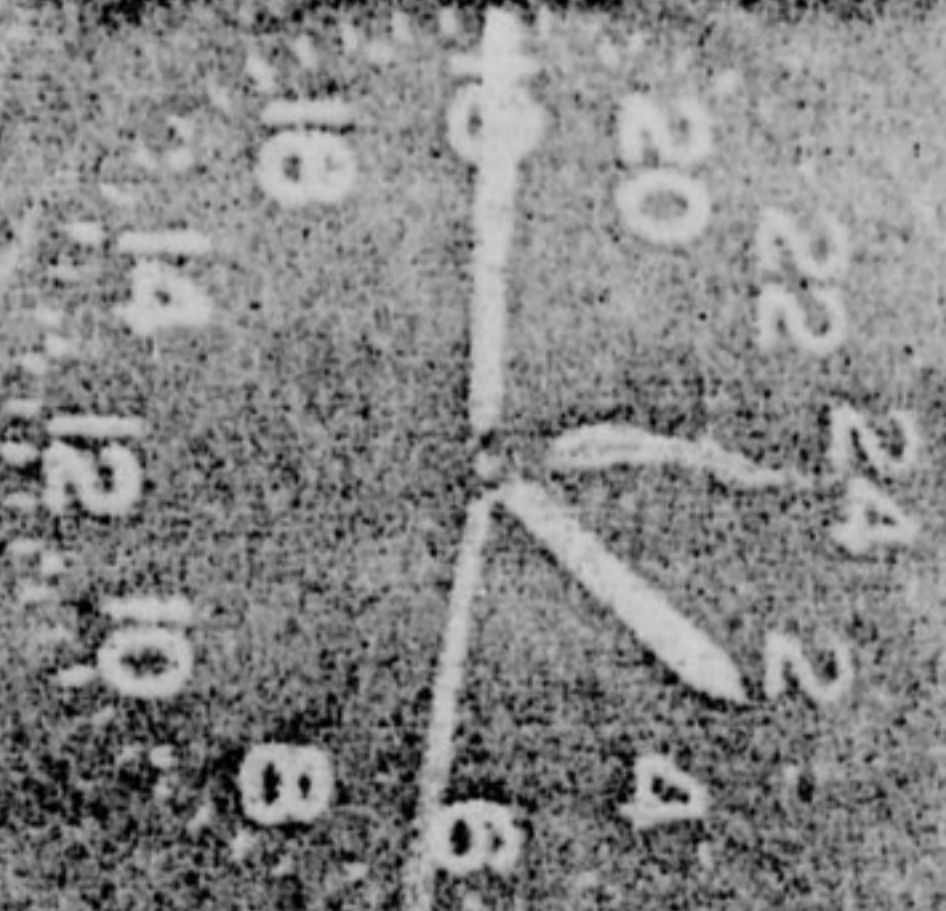
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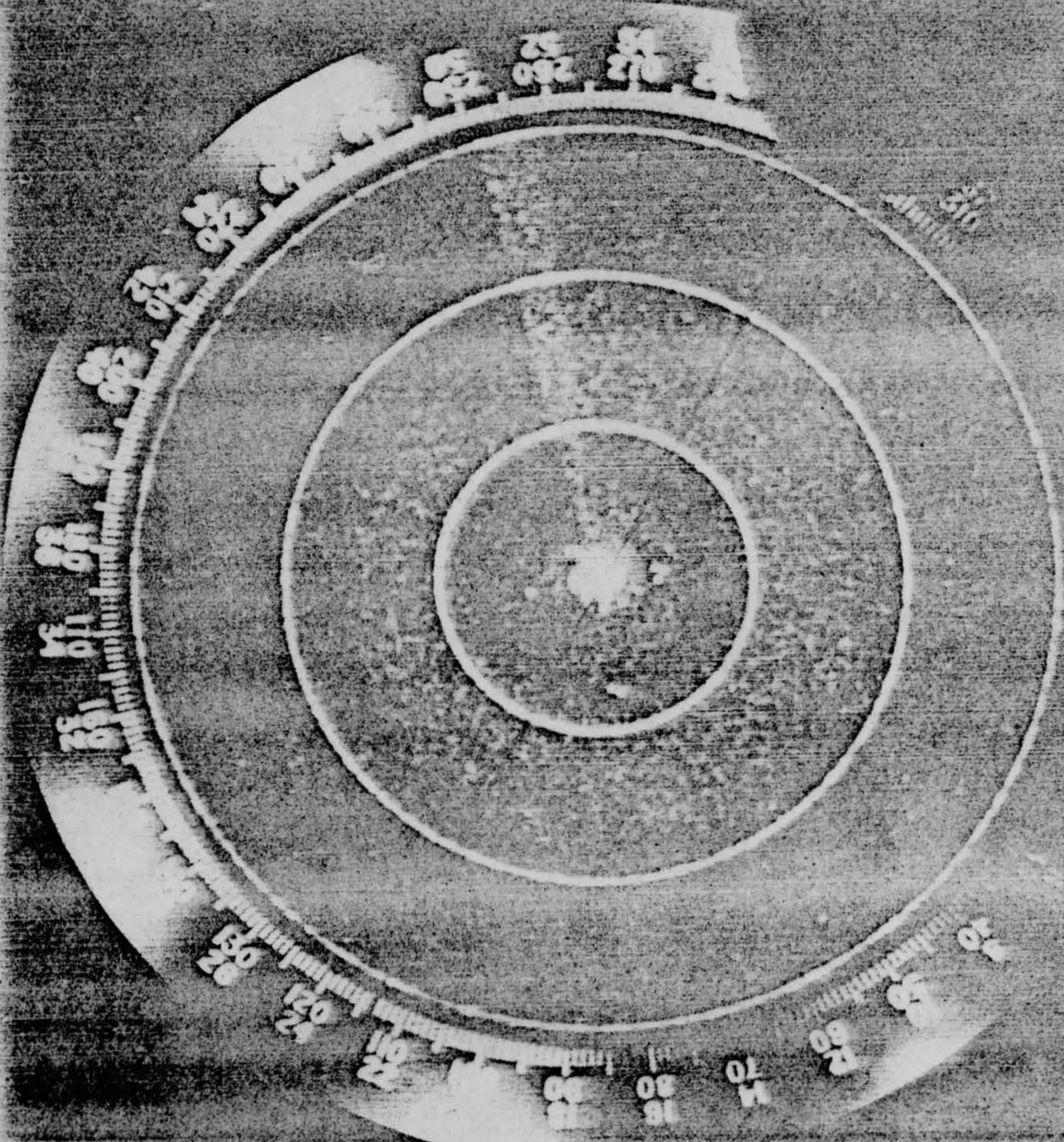
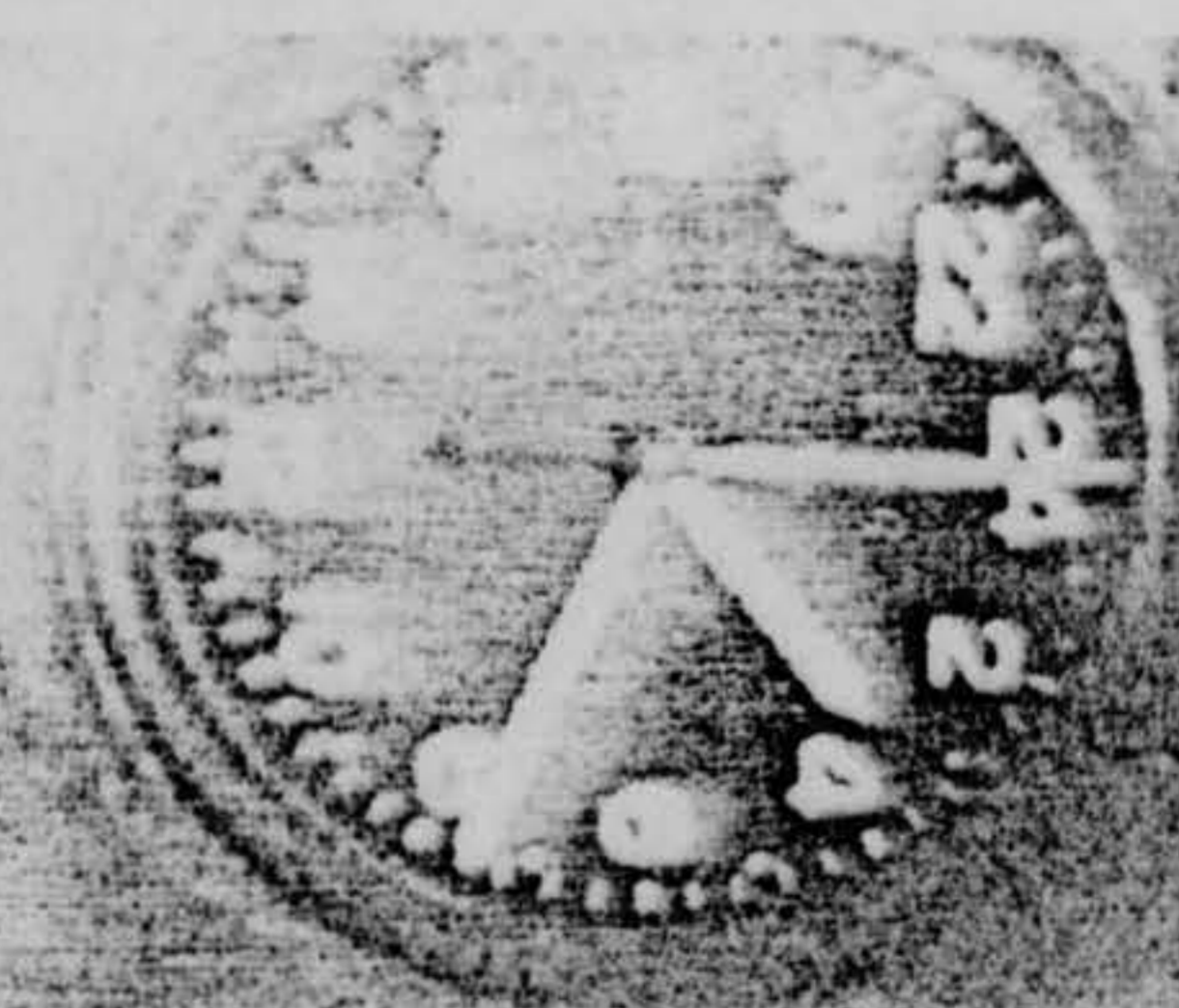
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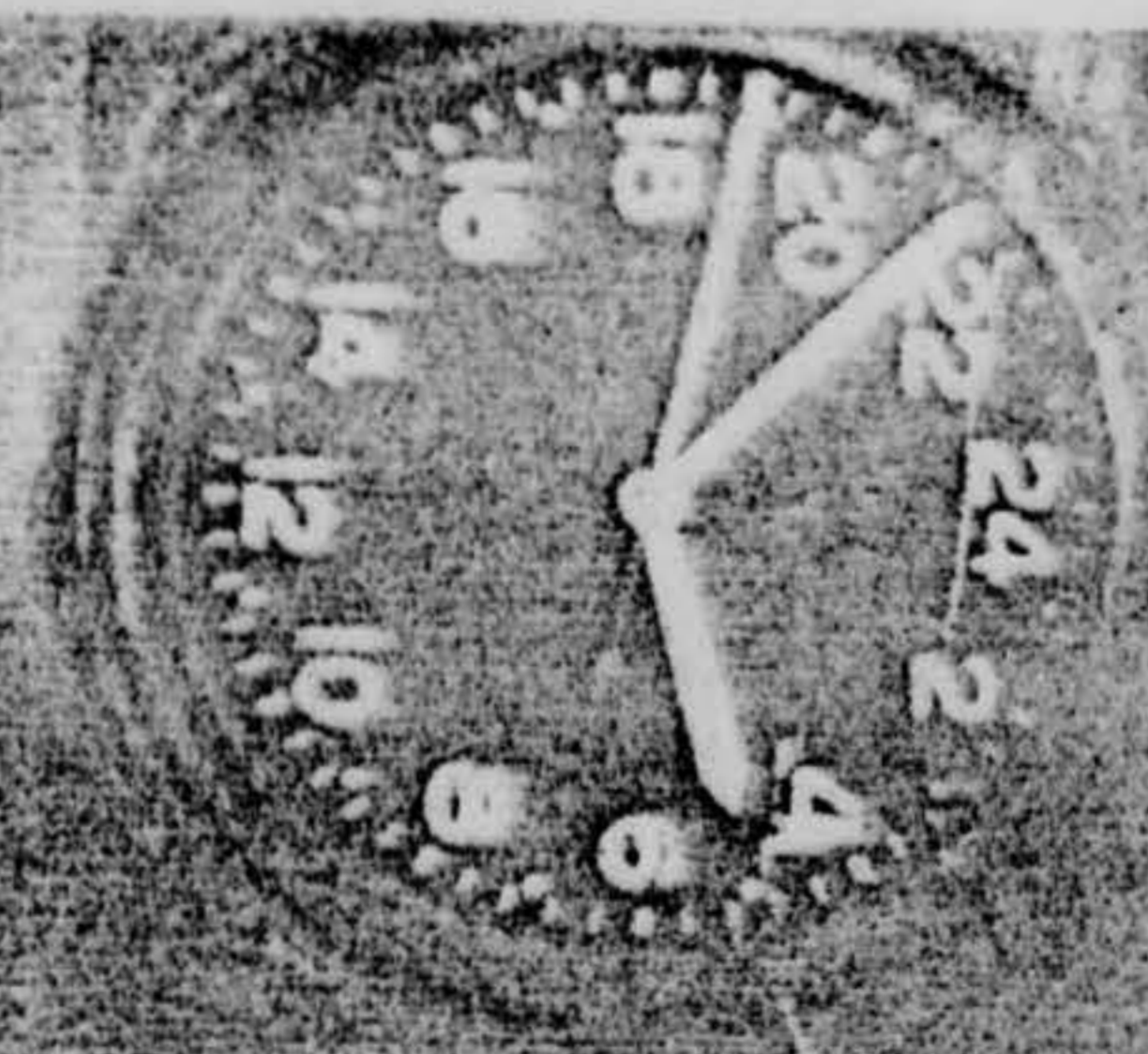

They appeared to be at angles estimated to be from 30° through 60° above the horizon. One witness who observed the separate dull red object, oval in shape, as only 5° - 10° above the horizon.

(3) The objects disappeared to the south while at generally the same elevation as initially observed.

(4) Objects moved from northeast-east through south very fast, and suddenly disappeared to the south. The dull red object seemed to move in from the east then moved rapidly south and suddenly disappeared with the other objects.

(5) The objects were observed over a period of 4 - 5 hours. The dull red object was observed only from 0635Z to 0637Z.

Bright pointed triangle again

The following is an extract from the Swiss newspaper *Pour Tous* No. 35 of August 24, 1965, translated by Gordon Creighton: "Our Bienne correspondent (G. A. Bourquin) here gives a brief account of sightings in the sky over Bienne as reported to him by three young men.

"I swear to you, Sir, we saw a flying saucer. You would have said it was a rotating slice of pineapple. It tilted slightly, and moving very fast from north to south along the Jura Mountains, towards the lake [*Lac de Biemme, near Neufchâtel*], and at a height level with the middle part of the mountains. We had the impression that it skimmed the rooftops of the houses in the Beaumont sector of the town. Suddenly it stopped, between Bienne and Vigneule, at the same time changing colour from yellow to dark red. In a fraction of a second after stopping, it had made an 180° turn, thus hiding from us its incandescent side. We could now see only the reddish border of its semi-circle.

"Then it took off again like lightning, towards the east, which involved a 90° change of course, and then it vanished suddenly just as though all its lights had gone out. I

might add that only seven or eight seconds elapsed between the object's appearance above the Taubenloch Gorges and its disappearance."

"This strange account was the start of a conversation—or rather an interrogation—lasting three hours, during the night of August 3-4 last. At about midnight on the night in question the doorbell of my flat rang three times. Three very excited young men had come to tell me of their experience. Had I not got the immediate impression that these three lads had just had some serious emotional shock I should have slammed the door in their faces when they breathed the word 'flying saucer'.

"A prudent, i.e., conscientious journalist must be as great a doubter as St. Thomas and possess the patience of Penelope. So, from August 7 onwards, I spent my nights with the three lads (Andreas and Erwin Jentsch — brothers — and Christian Haehlen, aged 19, 24, and 17 respectively) watching the skies over Bienne. No doubt I did this because their sincerity had convinced me. Yet somehow I remained sceptical.

"On the ninth night i.e. August 16, at 10.45, I saw the appearance of the first object which I could consider a valid sighting and a confirmation of my young friends' statement that 'mysterious objects are travelling our skies!'

"What I saw—and what was also seen by a friend of mine who was not with me (Heinz Schertenleib, chief bookkeeper of 68 rue Aebi, Bienne)—was a triangle with a luminous point at each of its angles. Its outline was shown by an extremely fine streak, a silvery thread.

"The size of the object was comparable to that of a small plane flying at 300 or 400 metres. *The triangle came from the south-west, did a vast circular sweep over the town, and then 'went out' suddenly, just as all the other objects have done that we have seen since that night.*

"Well, well. Can this perchance be the Dawn of the Magicians?"

AIR FORCE JETS CHASE SAUCER OVER LAKE SUPERIOR: A United Press International (UPI) story dated August 7th describes a chase involving jet interceptors and a group of seven to ten UFOs which were flying in a V-formation at 9,000 miles per hour in the vicinity of Duluth, Minnesota. Their elevation was 5,000 to 17,000 feet. The UFOs were spotted on radar at four bases - in Minnesota, Michigan, North Dakota, and Canada. The jets were easily outdistanced by the saucers, and soon abandoned the chase.

This information apparently was given to the UPI by the U. S. Air Force Radar Base in Michigan's Keweenaw Peninsula. SAUCER NEWS checked with the Pentagon about the case, and was informed that the base now denies - incredibly! - that the incident ever took place. It seems hardly likely to us that a reputable news service would just make up such a sensational story, and we are astounded at the contradiction here! (Our thanks to researcher John Williams for part of our data about this sighting.)



SUMMARY REPORTING OFFICER: The individual contacted who took photo's of a previous UFO in the Beaver area is Mr. [REDACTED] Brighton Twp. Mr. [REDACTED] brother [REDACTED] and a friend Mr. [REDACTED] Darson Ridge were also present when the photo was taken. The negative was given to the Beaver Valley Times and an article and the photo were released to the public by the Beaver Valley Times. Mr. [REDACTED] does not wish to give the negative to the Air Force at this time. The camera used was a Yashika 335, Twin lens reflex f3.5, 80mm blue coated, Copal MKV lens, 120 film. Itipan 21 Lumiere Rapid, 6x9 cm. Developed in Dektol 76 solution. The individual taking the picture has a dark room at his residence. The lens was open six to eight seconds and the camera took the picture from a tripod. At the time the UFO appeared, Mr. [REDACTED] was taking pictures of the moon. That was his original intention.

AIR FORCE INVESTIGATORS CHECKING REPORT

County Youth Snaps

Whether you properly call them UFOs (Unidentified Flying Objects) or revert to the once popular, "flying saucers," such unexplained phenomena arouse interest and curiosity.

There has been a rash of reports of such sightings across the nation recently, and appar-

ently Pittsburgh has had its share.

One of the most interesting reports in the Pittsburgh area comes from a Beaver County youth who supports his story with two friends and two photographs.

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he brought his story and pictures to the TIMES, but the U.S. Air Force now would like to see his pictures and talk with him.

JAMES LUCI, Gypsy Glen Road, Brighton Township, took the pictures about 11:30 p.m. last Sunday while snooting time

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The Air Force declined to say whether that report was by radar or by a person either on the ground or in an aircraft, but did tell the TIMES it would like to investigate this second report by Lucci.

One of the most convincing factors of the boy's story is his two pictures which were taken by time exposure with a tripod mounted camera.

Both pictures were taken from the same camera position, and upon superimposing the negatives so that the tree line and moon on each negative coincide, the bright object spotted by the boy had moved from a position on the left to the right.

Lucci's story is supported by two companions, his brother, John, 20, and Mike Grove, 17, Sycamore Drive, Dawson Ridge, Brighton Township, who also reported seeing the object. Tora Rodgers, 17, Seventh Street, Beaver, was in the house and when called, came out just in time to get a glimpse of the ob-

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The boys said that the object rose at a very high rate of speed and was gone quickly.

They judged it to be a little larger than a Piper Cub airplane and about a quarter mile in the air, although Lucci qualified his estimate by noting it is quite difficult to judge altitude from the ground at night.

THE BOYS said they saw an elliptical shaped object and did not see the glow which appeared

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In addition to the reported sighting nearer Pittsburgh about the same time as the boys saw the object Sunday, the Air Force said it has received quite a number of UFO

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UFO much-closer in second shot

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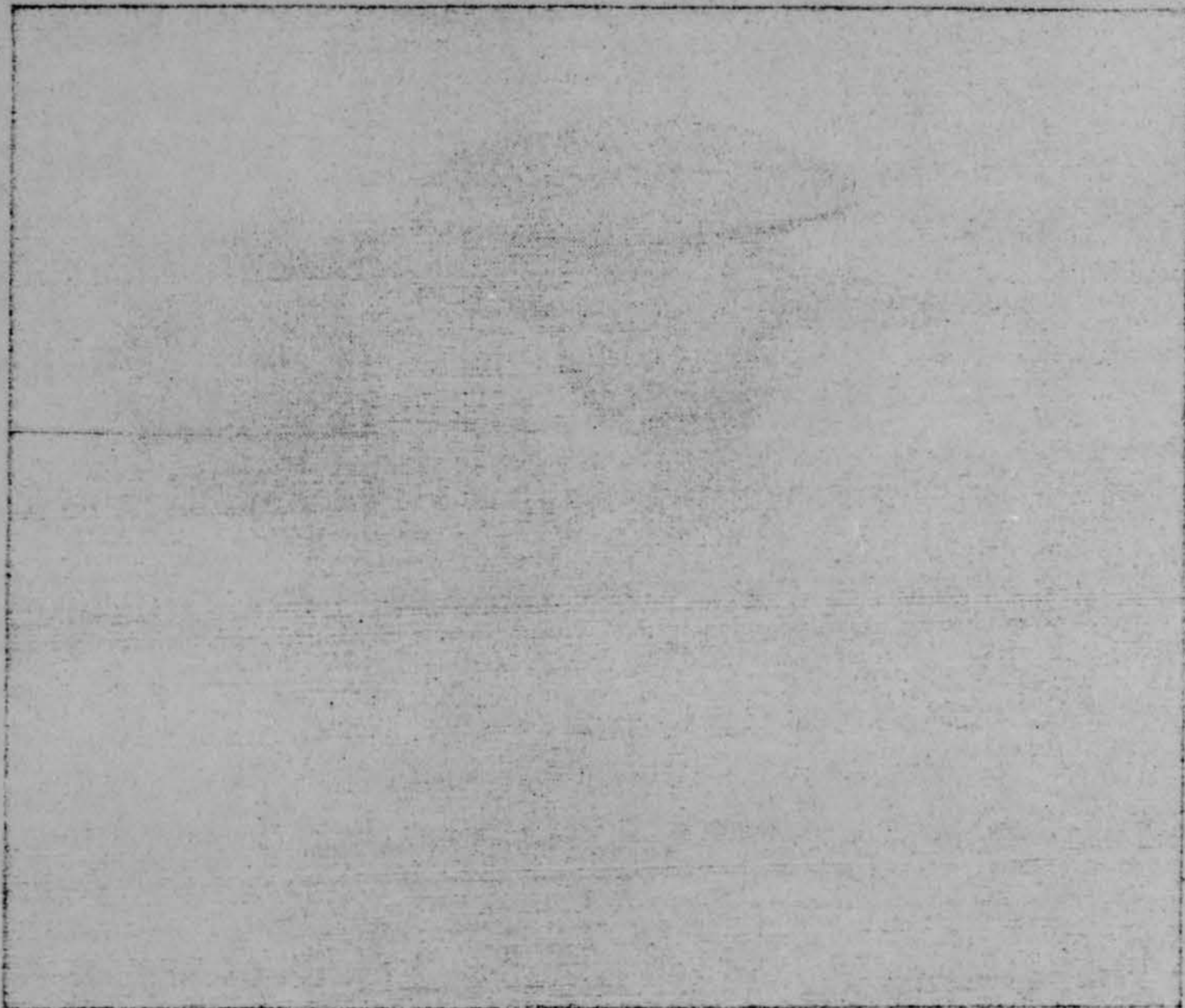
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Pictures of the UFO below, taken Aug. 8, in Beaver County, Pa., were declared genuine by three professional photographers who examined the negatives. (Signed evaluations given to NICAP in a five-day on-the-spot investigation.) Because of the close range (one-fourth mile) these photos have unusual detail.

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In the second photo (same negative) the trail and "exhaust" are blacked out to show the disc more clearly.



Following is the detailed report secured by NICAP investigators:

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(Later, the AF admitted to the press that a UFO was reported about this time, near Pittsburgh. Whether it was the same one, seen before or after the 11:30 sighting, is not known as the AF refused to give details.)

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According to the Luccis, the disc appeared "larger than a Piper Cub airplane."

When the Times story broke, the negatives were quickly obtained for NICAP analysis by William B. Weitzel, Chairman,

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"To the best of our knowledge, and in our considered judgment, the negatives are not the results of photographic or physical faking...nor is the UFO image thereon the result of any photographic accident such as reflections...lens flare... developer bubbles and the like... and said image appears to be the result of photographing a self-luminous object positioned in the field of view of the camera."

These conclusions were signed by City Editor Jack Mitchell, Photographer Peter D. Sabella, Reporter Thomas W. Schley, Managing Editor F.N. Hollendenner and Photographers Harry K. Frye and J. C. Gardner. In addition, the witnesses' high character was vouched for by the Chief of Police, Brighton Township, the high school principal and Beaver County police.





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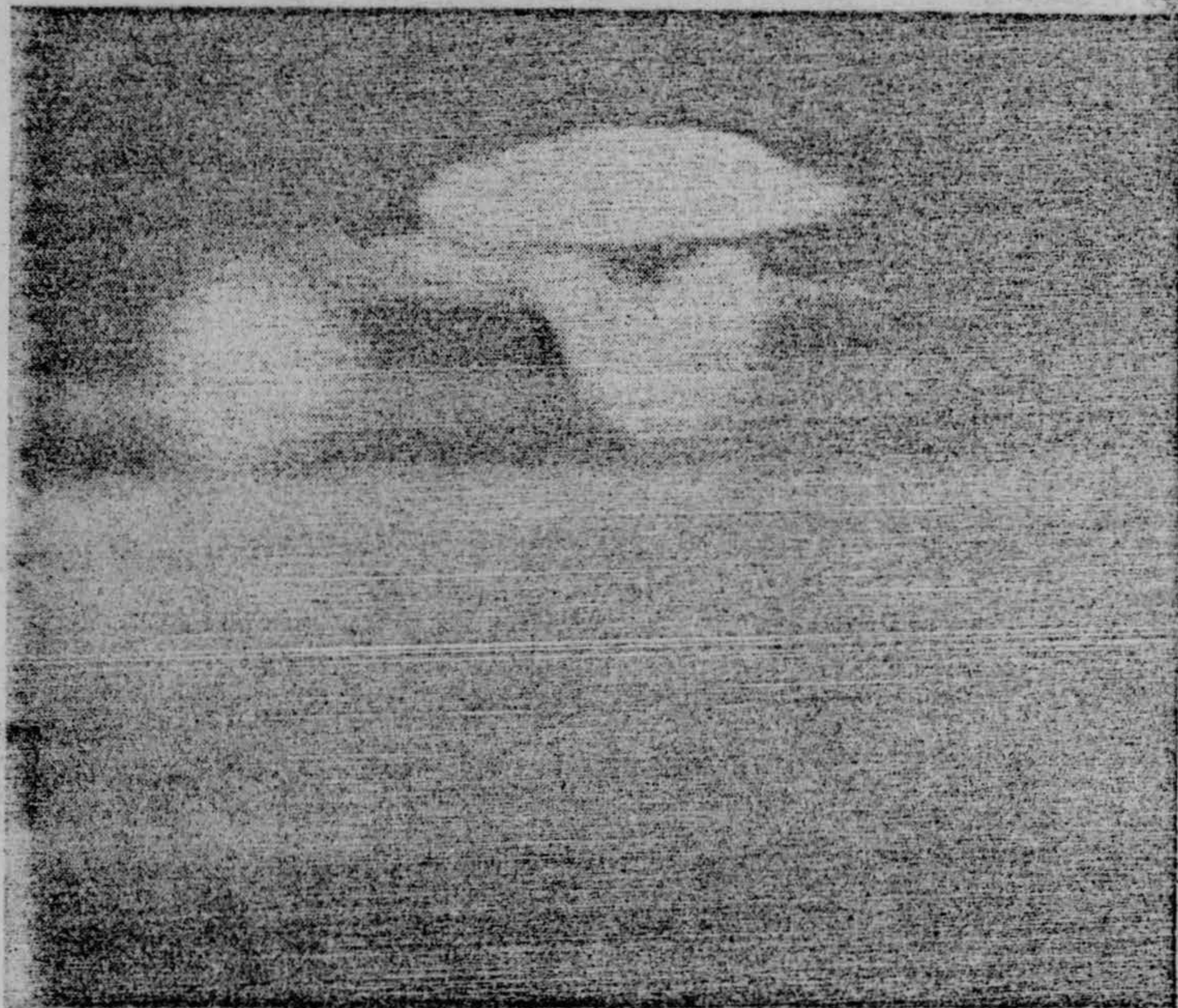

LANDING IN NORTH DAKOTA: Three women driving their car along a road near Grand Forks, North Dakota at 11:30 p.m. on August 9th witnessed a brightly-lighted object which had come to rest on a local golf course. The UFO was transparent, and was about 400 to 500 yards from their car. SIGHTINGS

Several sightings have been reported to F S I C during the month of October. Information is continuing to come in relation to the summer sightings, and the reports have continued into the fall months.

N.I.C.A.P. Investigators in the Pittsburgh, Pa., area have completed an investigation of a photograph of a U.F.O. taken in Beaver County, Pa., on August 8th. It's a night photo; it shows a disc-like object with a tapering trail which extends down toward the trees over which it maneuvered. The trail was not visible to the witnesses. The picture was declared genuine by three professional photographers. The picture was taken from an estimated one-fourth-mile.....

DAYLIGHT

Locally, a daylight sighting was made by two employees of Columbia Chemical of Pittsburgh Plate Glass Co, in Barberton, O. (16th St.)

The time was 1045 AM. on Friday, the 30th of October, 1965. The day was clear and mild. Gerald Lucart and Ernest Krasovic were working outdoors in the yard. They stopped to admire a high-flying jet that was trailing a long vapor trail.

A few moments later, as they crossed a part of the field, Lucart pointed to a place considerably lower than the jet-trail and asked Krasovic what it was he was seeing. Krasovic didn't see it immediately but then both men were observing a clearly outlined, very shiny bright, chrome-like ball. It came out of the north and approached until it took a stationary position at an elevation of 20 degrees. It remained in that position for from 11 to 15 seconds. It then changed shape and became a long narrow cigar-like object tapering from its middle to the rounded ends of the object. Suddenly after the elapsed time aforementioned, it accelerated away in a matter of from 4 to 6 seconds!! Lucart tried to alert welders some yards away but was apparently unsuccessful. It disappeared into the N.E.-losing none of it's elevation in relation to the horizon. Around 11:30 A.M. both men related that the sky was full of vapor trails made by criss-crossing planes in the same area the object had been in. This was also verified by other alert watchers in the Akron area. This lasted until 3:00 P.M. Both men declared that a camera would have recorded a picture. An estimate at altitude by Lucart was, 8,000 feet. Krasovic estimated its distance at 8 to 10 miles.

The object's intense brilliance did not change during th shape-changing maneuver. Both men were at a loss to explain its stationary position, its meteoric speed, its lack of aerodynamic features, and its extreme reflectivity or luminosity. No sound, trail etc was noted. No details marred its smooth surface.

On August 11, 1965 at 6:50 P.M. Gary Tetz reported seeing a clearly outlined round object he could not identify. It had a dull silver color. It came from the area of the sun and took only 8 seconds to move from an elevation of 30 degrees to a position almost overhead. He was driving on East Ave. near Battles Ave. Its path was generall S.W. to N.E...

On July 18, 1965, at 2:00 P.M., Joseph Bralek was driving N. on Brown St. near Cole & Lovers Lane. The day was clear and cool with a few clouds..Through his windshield he-saw silvery, round object..Its size was "like a dime in the sky", said Bralek. He stopped his car, got out, but there was nothing there to see, not even an airplane.

MYSTERY METAL FALLS IN MARYLAND: In the midst of a local saucer flap, strange metal fragments fell on the property of Peter Tuczinski, in Texas, Maryland, last August 11th. The metal rattled against his windows and onto the tin roof of his garage. The fragments, shown in the photo at the right, were sent to NASA. The report came back that preliminary tests had shown that they were not from a meteorite. Jim Wales, Baltimore's representative of Laura Mundero's semi-defunct Planetary Space Center, ventured the opinion that the metal was bits of "monitoring disks," sent out from friendly mother ships hovering high in our atmosphere. Perhaps NASA will come up with a better explanation, but as yet we do not know what their final conclusion will be.

Flying Objects: Quite A Few Are Reported

Telephoned reports of unidentified flying objects seen in the Seattle area Tuesday night continued coming to The Post-Intelligencer intermittently all day yesterday.

Many of the callers said that after reading similar reports in this newspaper yesterday they were reminded that they, too, had seen objects which they couldn't identify as airplanes, balloons, comets, clouds or birds.

"I was watering the lawn between 11:00 and midnight when I saw a bright light high over the trees," said one of the callers, Anna Beth Arnstad, 12705 Evanston Ave. N. "It was triangular in shape and flame colored. It moved swiftly in the twinkling of an

eye over the north dipper and disappeared."

F. C. Jennings, 2928-9th Ave. W., said he and his wife saw two circular shapes moving in a northeasterly direction between 8 and 9 p.m. One just "flew away" after they had looked for about three minutes. The other "hovered like a helicopter for six or seven minutes then disappeared rapidly."
