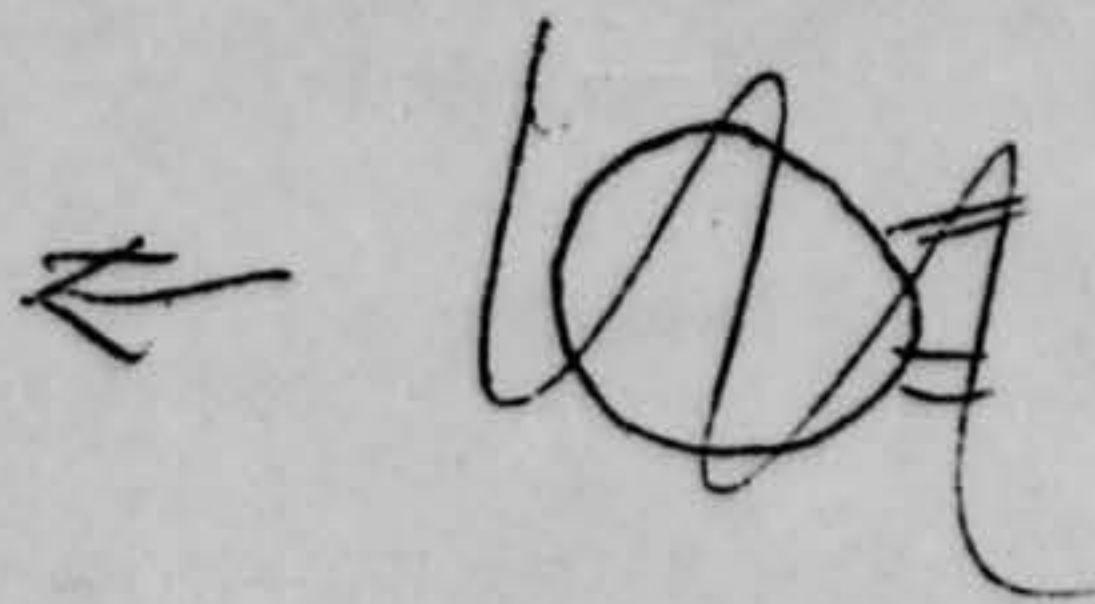

Sgt Moody contacted Oakdale, Pa for them to obtain object that allegedly fell from sky. Phone number [REDACTED] Asked them to have [REDACTED] send object COD. Major Quintanilla contacted Mr [REDACTED], Pa regarding the object which he had picked up. Mr [REDACTED] explained that the object was too fragile to mail. Similar to size of childs football. Color light gray with streaks of pale green, one one side rust color. It had craters in it. On the end was a tail. Saw it coming down, within 75 yards of object when it fell. It had a tail approximately 4ft long red and orange with blue tail, white glow. Around 91^{PM} (EDT) night before last (27 Sep 65). Doesn't want to put the object in mail. Its broken like an egg. There is a small hole in the ground, size of half dollar, there were three pieces with it. size of 50 cent piece of quarter. He wants assurance that the object would be returned to him in the original condition. Major Quintanilla explained that we might have to chip it in order to analyze it. He said that he didn't want Major Quintanilla to do this to the main object but could have the smaller pieces for analysis.



COMMENTS OF THE INVESTIGATING OFFICER:

Reference the three sightings of the UFO or light phenomena and the map which summarizes directions and angles of sightings. Allowing for discrepancies in observations attributed to untrained observers, it is believed that the three reports tend to be in fair agreement.

It is estimated that the phenomenon was caused by a relatively small meteorite which was observed relatively at low altitude and short range, and that the individuals observed the meteorite during the last few seconds of its life. Although this is not conclusive, the green color noted by Mrs. [REDACTED] is indicative of that given off by a ferrous meteorite. No other logical explanation for the cause has been determined by the Investigating Officer.

A check was made with personnel at the Griffiths Park Observatory, and it was also their opinion that the phenomenon as described could have been caused by a meteorite.



Mr. [REDACTED] said he could testify to the time pretty accurately as being between 9:40 and 9:45 PM, 9 September 1965, as he had been checking the time in his own interest just prior to the sighting. He was on his scooter, riding at a speed of about 15 to 20 MPH on Lemon Grove Avenue, just off Normandy Ave., Los Angeles, and estimated the phenomenon at the time of the sighting was in a S.W. direction from him at about 80° in elevation (nearly straight up). He was attracted to the sight because the light pattern in the sky was like nothing else he had ever seen - it was pointed, like a bullet or elliptical shape with a radiation on the surface or trailing edges of the elliptical surface. He rode along for one or two seconds, looking at the phenomena. Then he looked down because he was on his scooter to see where he was going, and when he looked up again the light pattern had doubled in size, leaving him with the impression it had come quite near. In his estimation the light pattern had not changed shape. So he stopped the scooter, and when he looked up again, the thing was gone. Total elapsed time of both sightings was no more than five seconds.

Mr. [REDACTED] stated that the moon was full and clear. For Los Angeles, it was a clear night, especially when looking upwards.

Mr. [REDACTED] couldn't determine how far away the object was, how high, or its size. He said it looked very low down. At first it appeared about saucer size, and then changed to a size of about a dinner plate or serving plate which is larger than a dinner plate. The light looked like electrical house light.

Mr [redacted] repeated the object was an elliptical shape, or bullet shaped. It moved from a distant position toward him and didn't move horizontally. He saw the object twice: once smaller and once larger. He interpreted the change in size as movement - skyward-groundward movement would be the direction.

Mr [REDACTED] said he could testify to the time pretty accurately as being between 9:40 and 9:45 PM, 9 September 1965, as he had been checking the time in his own interest just prior to the sighting. He was on his scooter, riding at a speed of about 15 to 20 MPH on Lemon Grove Avenue, just off Normandy Ave., Los Angeles, and estimated he was northwest of the phenomenon at the time of the sighting. He was attracted to the sight because it was a symmetrical light pattern in the sky. The symmetry, the whole phenomena was like nothing else he had ever seen - it was pointed, like a bullet or elliptical shape with a radiation on the surface or trailing edges of the elliptical surface. His first reaction was that it was probably back lighting from the moon through the clouds. He rode along, looking at the phenomena; he looked because of the unusual symmetry, a symmetry not ordinarily found in nature. Then he looked down because he was on his scooter to see where he was going, and when he looked up again the light pattern had doubled in size, leaving him with the impression it had come quite near. In his estimation, when the light pattern had not changed shape - as natural phenomena ordinarily do - but in this doubling in size the shaped remained constant. He then assumed it was more of a light pattern moving across clouds, but because that undulates and changes quite rapidly because of the moon in the clouds, he did not believe this was what he had visually observed. So he stopped the scooter, and when he looked up again, the thing was gone.

Mr [REDACTED] stated that the moon was full and clear, not behind billowing clouds. The haze path was smooth from the ocean and things like that. The haze was on the horizon and just faded into the stars and moon. He didn't see any billowing clouds. The moon was very bright, for in the city, and what appeared to be haze was on the horizon. He was next to the freeway, and it rides high there and doesn't obscure visibility. For Los Angeles, it was a clear night.

Mr [REDACTED] couldn't determine how far away the object was, how high, or its size. He said it looked very low down. At first it appeared about saucer size, and then changed to a size of about a dinner plate or serving plate which is larger than a dinner plate.

The cloud, or phenomena, was light. The light looked like electrical light and could have been one of two things: light reflecting on a metal surface, or it could have been produced light itself, but he couldn't determine which.

Mr [REDACTED] repeated that the object was an elliptical shape, or bullet shaped. It moved from a distant position toward him and didn't move horizontally. He saw the object twice: once smaller and once larger. He interpreted the change in size as movement - skyward-groundward movement would be the direction.

Mr [REDACTED] and his wife [REDACTED] were visiting Mr [REDACTED], an electrical engineer, North American Aviation Inc, Autonetics Division, Anaheim, Calif., at the [REDACTED] residence, [REDACTED] Way, Cypress, Calif., at the time of the sighting. The [REDACTED] were on the point of departure when Mrs [REDACTED] first sighted the alleged UFO while the three were standing in the front yard. She asked if that bright object were an airplane, then all looked. The object was about 30° to 40° above the horizon. All of a sudden they sighted the light, a fairly bright white-yellow light in the form of an elongated crescent. The trailing edges of the arc were to the north with the bottom of the arc or round side toward the direction of motion, or south. They first noticed the object to the NNW. At first the object appeared to move rather slowly, then seemed to speed up and then it disappeared. When last seen it was to the West.


Mr [REDACTED] personally observed the alleged UFO for about seven seconds, his wife observed it a little longer time. Mr [REDACTED] said he looked to see if it were landing lights, or some such, as he had spent four years in the U.S. Air Force and knew what landing lights and navigation lights were. But this light was not an aircraft light.

He said he had no way of telling how far away or at what altitude the object was. They watched the area where the light went out to try to see if any airplane flashing lights or warning lights were present, but to the best of his knowledge he could not see any aircraft in the area at that time. Neither before nor after the light was extinguished did they hear any aircraft or see any aircraft lights. Mr [REDACTED] said he had never seen anything like this before.

It was not the moon, Mr █████ continued, because the moon was SSE position about that time. The object was about the shape of an elongated quarter moon; it was much larger than the size of a star.

Mr █████ was contacted and his account of the sighting was essentially the same as that of Mr █████ except for the following:

- a. He estimated the angle of elevation to be about 50° to 55° .
- b. He observed the light for a much shorter period of time at an estimated 30° arc, azimuth about 290° to 260° .
- c. He thought the light had gone out behind a cloud or thick haze.

Mr [redacted] and his wife [redacted] were visiting Mr. [redacted], an electri-
cal engineer, North American Aviation Inc, Autonetics Division, Ana-


Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that between 9:45 and 10:00 PM, 9 Sept 65, she, her husband, and a neighbor, ([REDACTED] Ave, Torrance) saw the object. The following is her description:

It was a real thick object shaped like a saucer and had a slight glow to it. It was observed at an estimated angle of elevation of about 40° to 50°. It was so "bright" out last night, no clouds in the sky, it was as clear as a bell.

It is hard to say how far away it was; it looked as though it was hovering, but moving toward them. It didn't change shape; it was just like a thick saucer. It had a real, wierd glow. The overall color was yellow like electrical house lights are yellow. The center section was a real pale green.

The object was to the west of where Mrs. [REDACTED] lives. It appeared at first to be hovering and then moving in a North to South direction when it suddenly went out of sight. (COMMENT: This slightly contradicts her statement that the object was also moving towards them. However, Mrs. [REDACTED] states that both of her statements are correct.

Mrs [REDACTED] stated that between 9:45 and 10:00 PM, 9 Sept 65, she, her husband, and a neighbor ([REDACTED] Ave., Torrance) saw the object. The following is her description:

It was a real thick object shaped like a saucer and had a slight glow to it, kind of green, a real slight, pale glow and it looked like the outer rim - the glow was the light causing the outer edges to glow. It was there about three to four seconds from what they figured out.

It seemed it - like once they saw it, it left, whatever it was. It was so bright out last night, no clouds in the sky, it was as clear as a bell. Their first thought was that maybe it was a plane with the vapor, but there was no plane, nothing. It was the weirdest thing.

It is hard to say how far away it was; it looked as though it was hovering, but moving toward them. Mrs. [REDACTED] said she was kinda scared. It was close enough that she saw what she saw.

Mrs. [REDACTED] said she would say it was low in the sky compared to being high. It didn't change shape; it was just like a thick, thick saucer. She didn't see a dome on top, but it was like a saucer. It had a bright light on it, making the whole thing glow real weird. The light was a yellow like the electrical house lights are yellow. It was a real pale green from the time she saw it; the main light was causing the yellow glow around the outer rim; only the middle showed up green. The glow from the light made the outer rim of yellow glow, and they hadn't had a drink, she added. This was the first one she had ever seen.

The object was to the west of where Mrs [REDACTED] lives and appeared to be spinning south. It appeared at first to be hovering and then it completely spun out of sight. If it had been a plane or a missile that had blown up she would have seen it because she had seen missiles blow up or gone up and this was something entirely different.

Mrs. ██████ commented that her husband thinks this is stupid and doesn't believe in it, (meaning flying saucers and unidentified objects in general) and for him to think it could possibly seem to amaze her. She added that they stood out there for a long time afterwards to see whether it was a missile, but it was nothing like that. The movement seemed to be controlled. It wasn't like a missile running wild and blowing. She had seen such at Vanguard around Buena Vista, Calif., months ago.

Mrs. ██████ said she had waited until around 3:22 PM/10 Sept 65 to call because she had waited to see if there had been anything in the papers.






