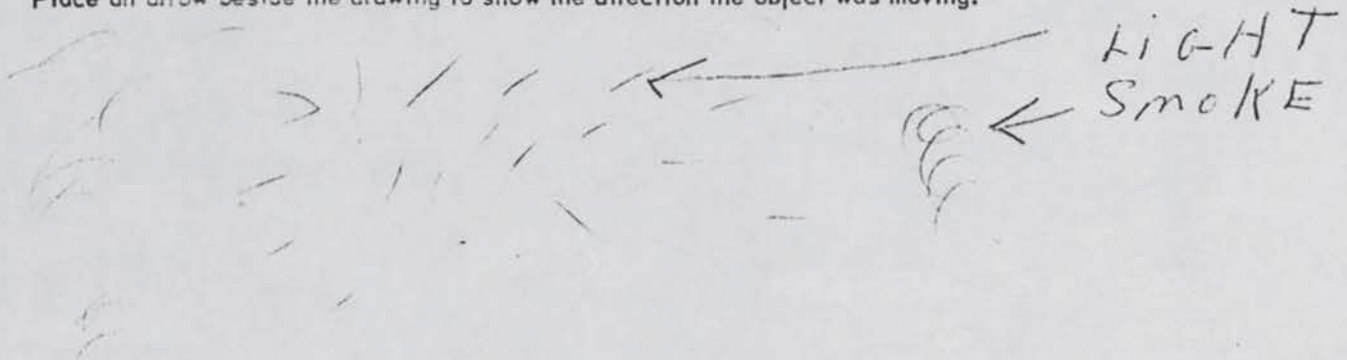

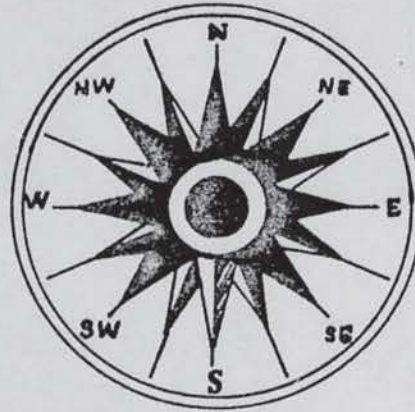
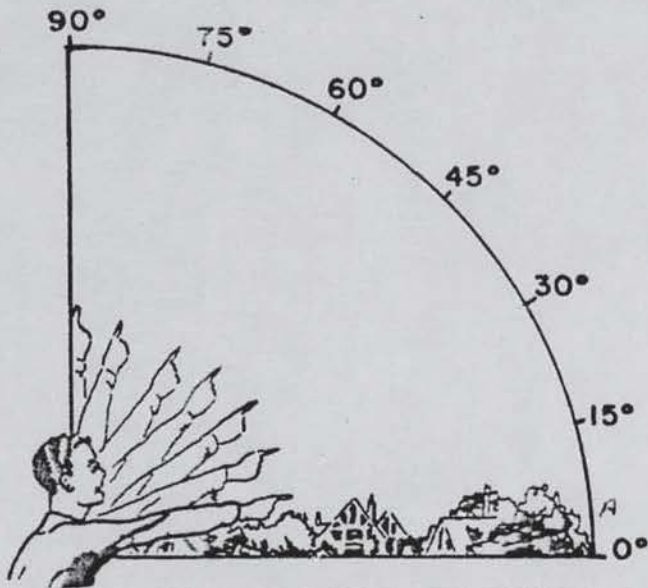

The object stop, ~~just~~ at our window, flashing a bright light, as though it was hovering there making a spinning sound and giving off a lot of smoke. So I ran down stairs to get a better look, but when I got there it was gone from sight, the light, sound, but the sky was full of smoke. In a few minutes the smoke cleared up.

1. Mr. [REDACTED] stated he was hesitant to tell anyone about what he saw and heard until he read in the paper about the flying objects as reportedly seen by a group of people in Michigan last week.

2. "We were laying back on the bed watching the late show about 1 A.M. We heard this noise coming from above. The brightness of the lights lit up the whole apartment so fast. Nothing struck our apartment, but object continued to hover just above our window. The flashing lights were white and smokey, lots of smoke I would say. Not a howl, more like 'yen, yen! yen'. A different repeating sound from whirling helicopter, and all the time just above our window. It was blinking the brightest lights, white smokey color. My wife and I both jumped up to look out. So much smoke all around object and flashing lights. I pulled on my pants and when I got down the steps the outside air was still full of smoke. Object seemed to have gone straight up. Would guess the object was about five feet across and enveloped in smoke. No one else in the apartment saw or heard the object."

Analysis of Australian UFO Photographs

Hq USAF (SAFOICC)

1. Photo analysis has been accomplished on the attached photographs. A positive identification or description of the UFO is not possible with the photographic information available and without the original negatives. However, there are several comments which may prove relevant to the analysis.

a. The image does not appear to be the result of any processing effect.

b. It appears that the shutter speed used was considerably longer than the stated 1/2 second. The distance covered by the vehicles during the time of exposure, as indicated by their light tracks, is much too high to have occurred in 1/2 second. In fact, a speed far in excess of 100 mph would be indicated by a 1/2 second exposure time. Speed calculations for the vehicles were made using an average distance of 80 feet between light poles. Had more exposures been available and had the image been more clearly defined, a broad approximation of rate of movement could probably have been derived.

c. It is noted that there is no reflection of the bright image on the water although it was stated to be only 20 feet above the water. The reflections of the street lights are quite evident. It is possible that some obstruction in the foreground could have blocked the view of a reflection from the image.

d. No measurements are possible due to the halation of the bright image.

2. Since there is no indication of threat to the security of the United States, it is felt that additional investigation into these photographs of alleged UFOs is not in the best interest of Department of Defense funds. Therefore, no further attempt will be made to evaluate the cause of the image on the attached photographs.

He said that he and several other boys, not in Staples were sending up balloons with flares attached. He said that I should speak to William Eyer of 5 Yankee Hill Rd., Westport as he was the head of this group of boys. At 3:30 PM I spoke to [redacted] age 19 at his home at 5 Yankee Hill along with his mother. He said that he and [redacted], and [redacted] had been buying surplus weather balloons in NYC and filling them with Hydrogen gas and attaching a flare with a 2 1/2 minute fuse and sending them aloft during the evenings. He had one unused one in his cellar which he gave to me. They were paying \$1.50 apiece for them. The flares were purchased at Barkers and the fuses were bought at the hobby shop. The bottled gas was purchased at the Conn. Gas Co. in Bpt. The original balloon sent up was just an experiment but when they ~~xxx~~ read in the paper about the unknown object in the sky they decided to keep sending them up. They were told to stop sending these up and told that a warrant may be issued for them.

The object seen in the summer of 1956 in Tarara Beach, Cuba was of the exact, same shape. That time we saw it clearly. It was about 100 feet off the sea and stopped in the air also. This object was about 200 yards away from the house and came closer until it passed over us, no more than 80 feet above us. No sound was heard but a slow whistle or whine and nothing could be seen except a bright ball of light. The rays of light which looked like whiskers moved from side to side all the time, and sometimes ~~criss-cross~~ criss-crossing each other. My mother and aunt were witnesses.
