K. AIRMAN BULKLEY WAS THOROUGHLY DEBRIEFED BY LT MATHEW BIRD,

AIRMAN APPEARED QUITE SINCERE AND WAS FULLY AWARE OF THE IMPORTANCE
OF ACCURATE REPORTING OF THE INCIDENT. UPON REPEATED QUESTIONING,
AIRMAN BULKLEY SEEMED QUITE SURE OF ALL DETAILS RELATING TO THE
SIGHTING. THIS SIGHTING WAS CONFIRMED BY FOUR OTHER AIR POLICEMEN,
STATIONED AT DIFFERENT LOCATIONS AT PHAN RANG. OBSERVATIONS WERE

ALSO REPORTED AT CAM RANH BAY AT APPROX THE SAME TIME, BUT THOSE REPORTS STATE THT THE OBJECT SIGHTED THERE WAS SLOW MOVING AND APPEARED TO BE A WEATHER BALLOON WITH A LIGHT ATTACHED. THE PHAN RANG CONTROL TOWER AND THE GCA FACILITY HAD NO REPORTED TRAFFIC IN THE AREA, AND NEITHER VISUAL OR RADAR CONTACT AT THE INCIDENT TIME. IN ADD IT ION, THE BASE WEATHER STATION DID NOT HAVE A WEATHER OBSERVAT ION BALLOON AIRBORNE DURING THIS TIME PERIOD. BECAUSE OF THE APPARENT DISCREPANCIES BETWEEN THE PHAN RANG AND CAM RANH BAY SIGHTINGS A CONCL USIVE EVALUATION CANNOT BE MADE AT THIS TIME.
