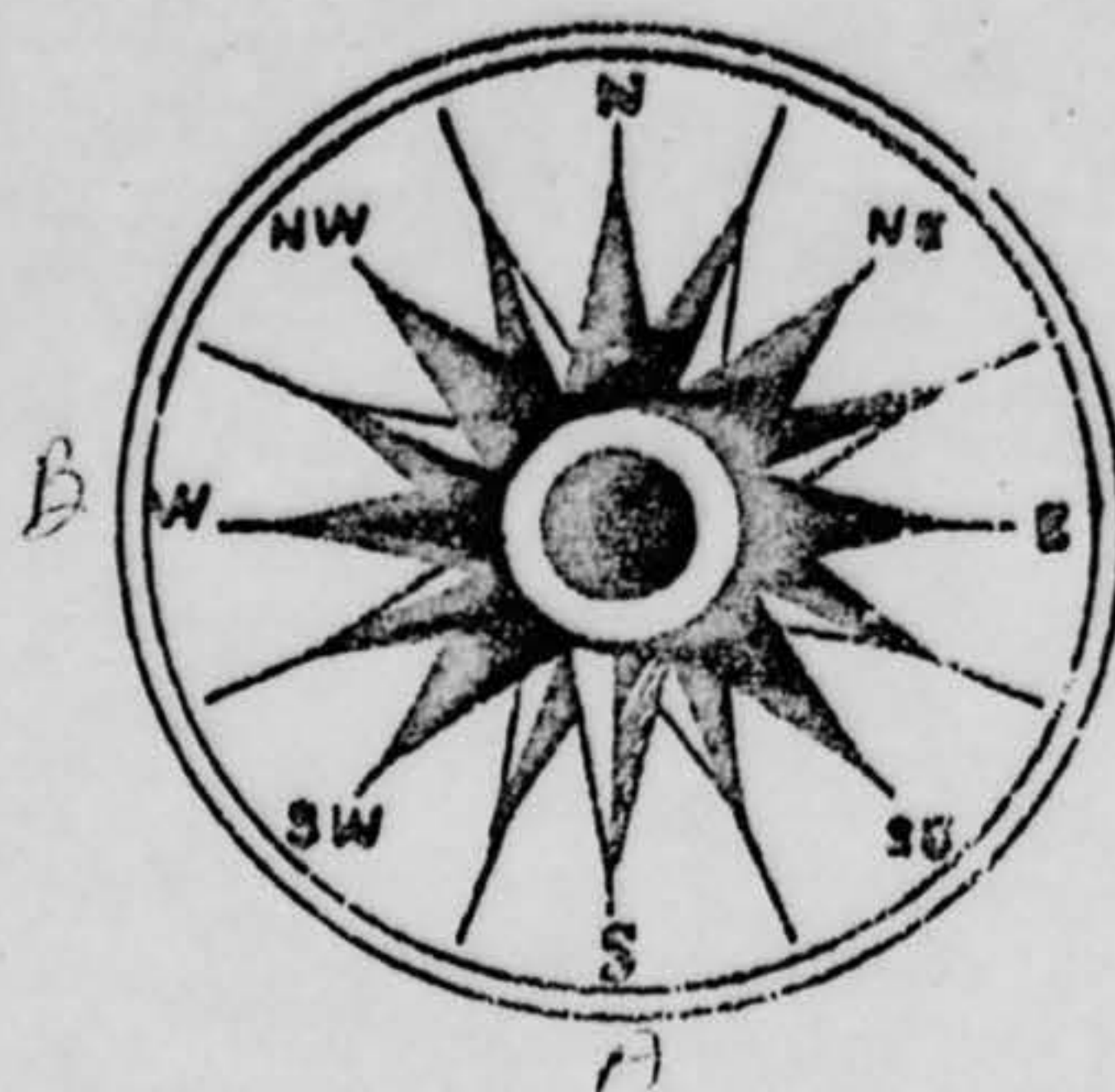
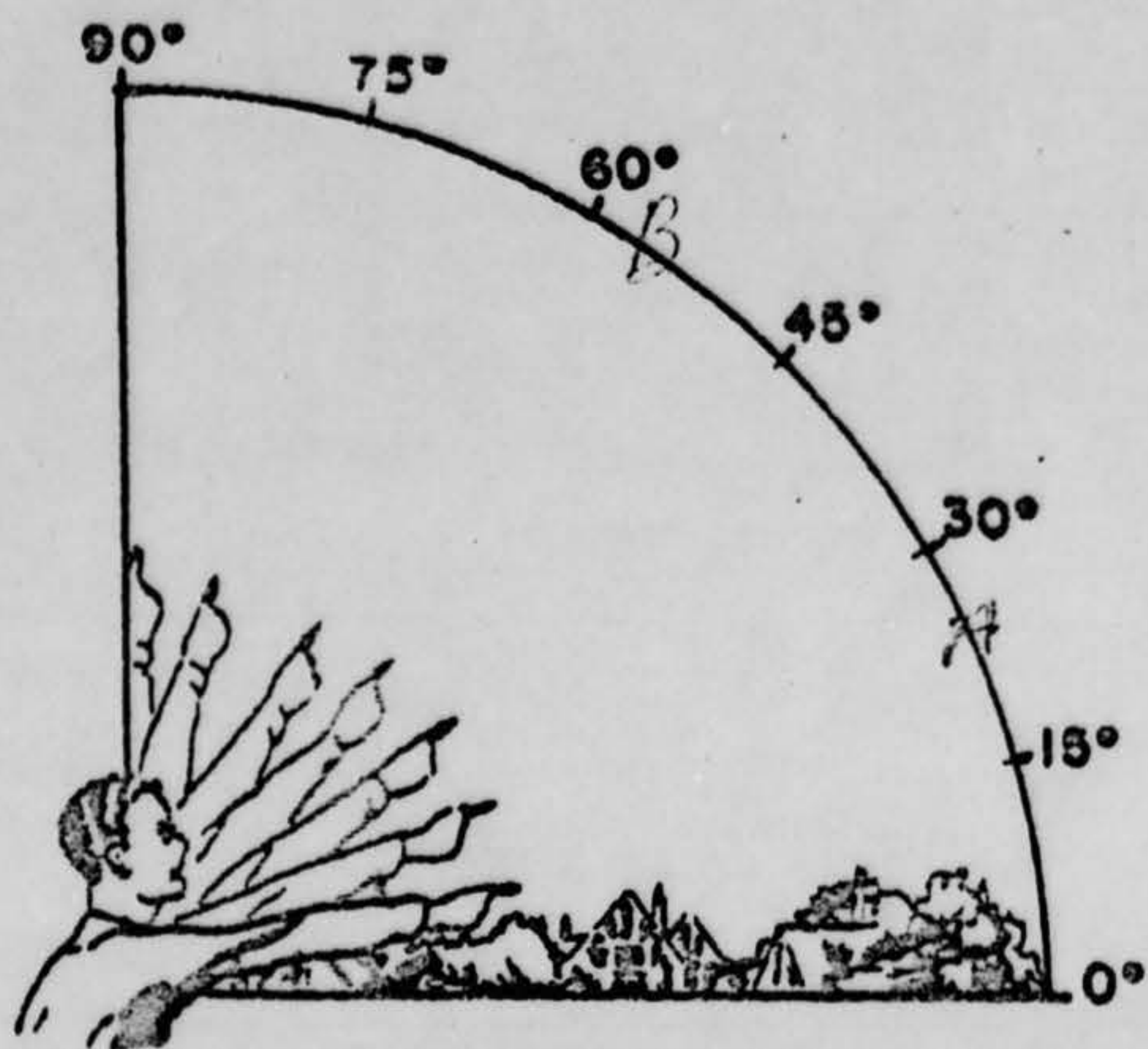

35. Information which you feel pertinent and which is not adequately covered in the specific points of the questionnaire or a narrative explanation of your sighting.

When I first saw it, it was like a giant sun hanging in the sky. It was low, perhaps fifty feet up, and perhaps only about 200 feet from me. I had not seen anything, and all of a sudden it was there. It apparently had come from behind the trees and the big building we use as a gym, dining room, kitchen, etc.

My first thought was that it was a trick of some sort, and I stopped and watched it, trying to figure out what it could be. It was not moving at that time. Suddenly it pointed down and darted toward me, stopping almost directly overhead, so that I had to look up to see it. When it started to move toward me, I began moving up the driveway to get back to my house, but when it stopped above me, I stopped also to look. As I looked, I could see a vertical shape of some kind in the transparent structure above the light, and at that point I became frightened and urged my dog to hurry to the house with me.

At about that same time a number of students came rushing out of the west wing of the dormitory and stood in the doorway, watching the object. Seeing them, I began crossing the lawn toward them. They were talking among themselves, very excitedly, and I could hear them saying, "Look at that thing! Gad, look at that thing!" I called to them, but not very loudly, "What is it? What is it?" but they did not hear me. As we watched, the object was drifting, very slowly, over toward the gymnasium (in a westerly direction) and then started drifting along the roof, northwesterly. I heard the students saying, "It is going to land on the roof." I was thinking the same thing, and I was concerned, because I was afraid it would set fire to the building, and I remember saying, "Get off my roof! Get off my roof!" The object hovered over the far end of the roof, began to settle as though it were going to land, hesitated, and then all of a sudden rose slightly and took off toward the trees above the shore of the lake. (There is a sharp drop to the lake level.) We saw the light bobbing up and down a few times through the trees, and then it disappeared.

The students went back inside (this was after Taps and they had been in bed) and I took my dog back into my house. Then I went over to the dormitory to talk to the night watchman. He had not seen the object, because he had been trying to restore order and quiet in the dorm. He asked me whether it could have been a helicopter, and I said no, for there had been no noise. I asked him how the boys had become aware of it, and he said all he knew was that someone had shouted out, "There's a deely out there!" Then had followed some rushing to the windows and the rushing of some of the boys in the west wing to the front door, where they had stood and watched. As we were talking, I suddenly saw the object, easily recognizable because of the brilliant orange light, flying high and far out over the ocean. [REDACTED] the night watchman, looked for it as I saw, "There it is," but as I said so, it disappeared. A moment later the light appeared again, still higher and farther out, and this time he saw it. It showed only momentarily and then it disappeared and we did not see it again.

It appeared to me to be shaped something like a blender, wider at the top and tapering to the bottom. It did not look like a saucer or a dome. Whatever it was that I saw inside it could have been a person, and there was a distance of at least two or three feet between the top of it and the top of the lighted area. There was plenty of space around it, as there would be in the case of a person in a room.



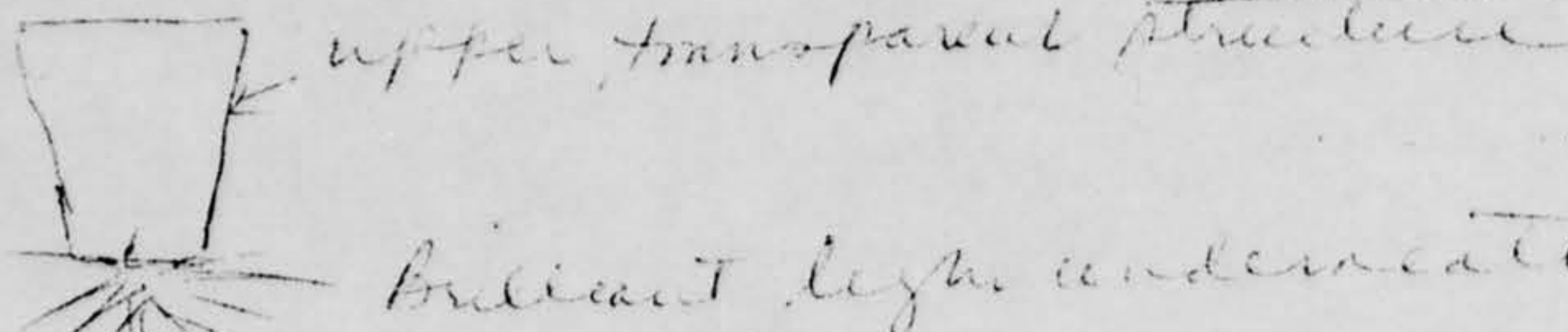
