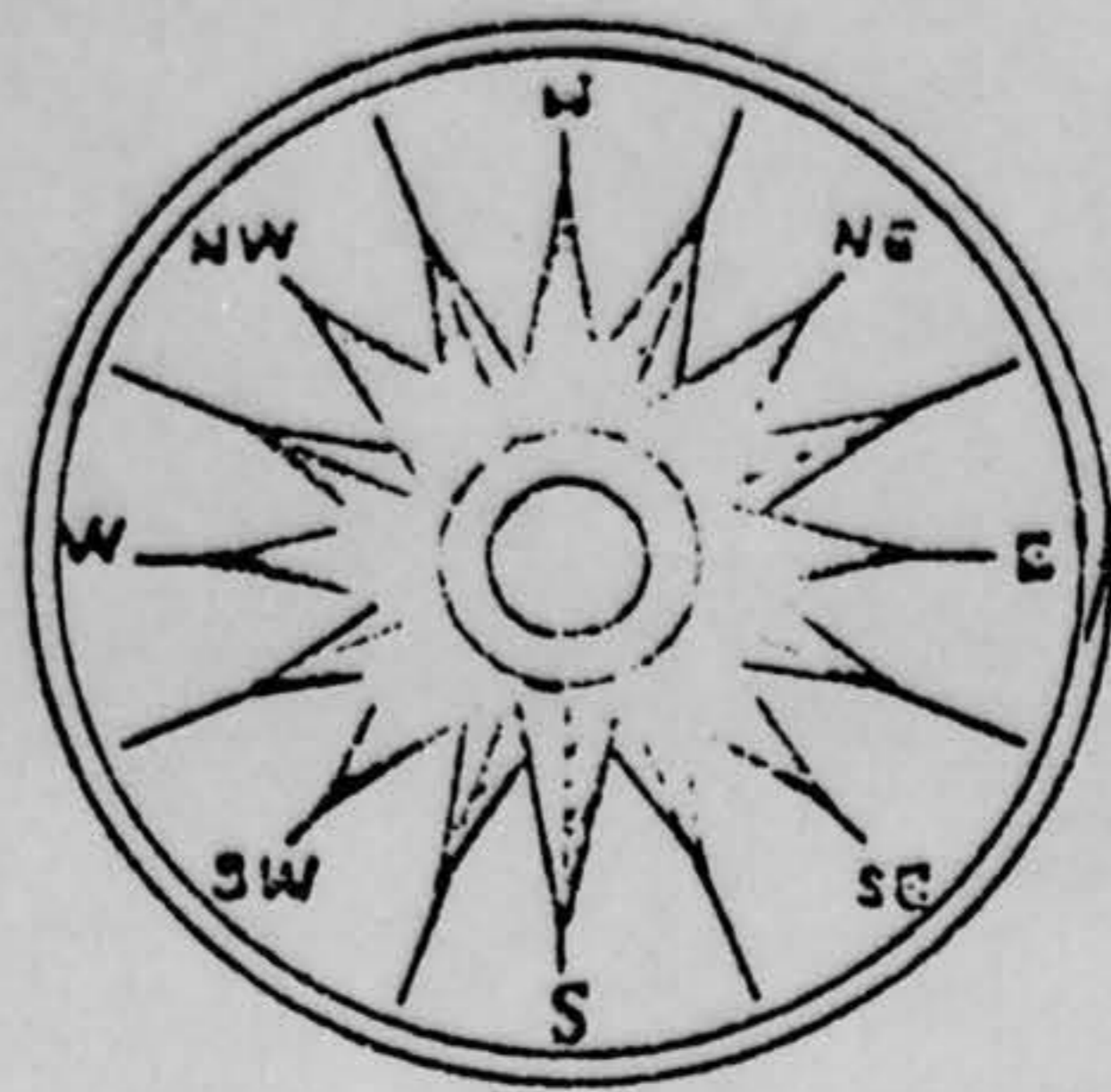
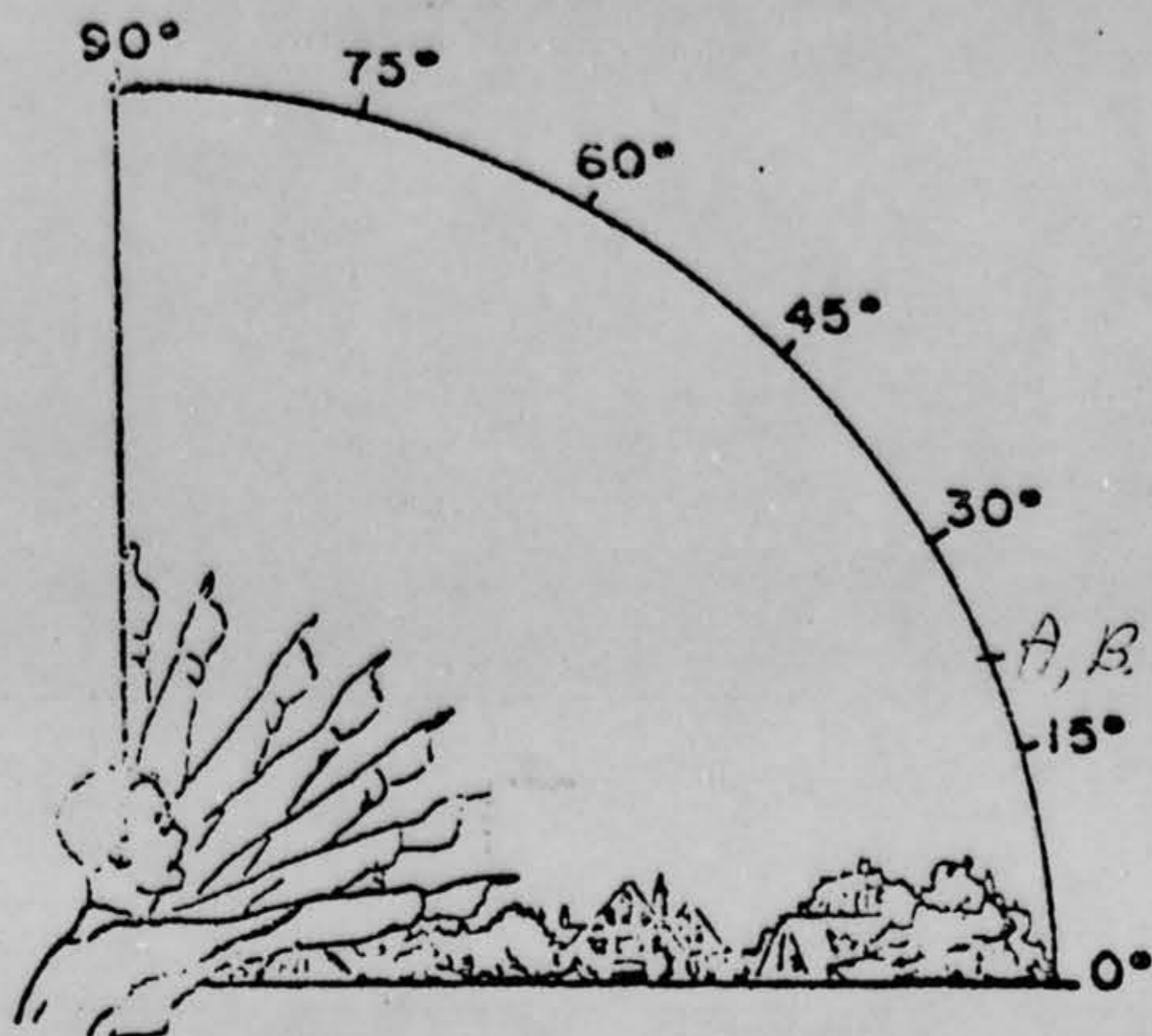

### Some Ball in the Sky

Utica Press reporters last night received three reports of a large orange ball along the Southern horizon. The reports came from West Winfield, Whitesboro and New York Mills.

Callers said the ball appeared to be larger than the moon. It first appeared as a very bright light and then seemed to disappear as if being covered by a cloud.

The object then reappeared, grew very bright and then seemed to explode.

Mrs. Kenneth Davis, West Winfield Press correspondent, said she saw the unidentified object shortly before 7 p. m.

The Old Farmers Almanac said the moon would rise at 8:29 a. m. today. It reported that the moon set at 8:22 a. m. yesterday. Therefore the moon would not have been visible at the time the object was seen.
