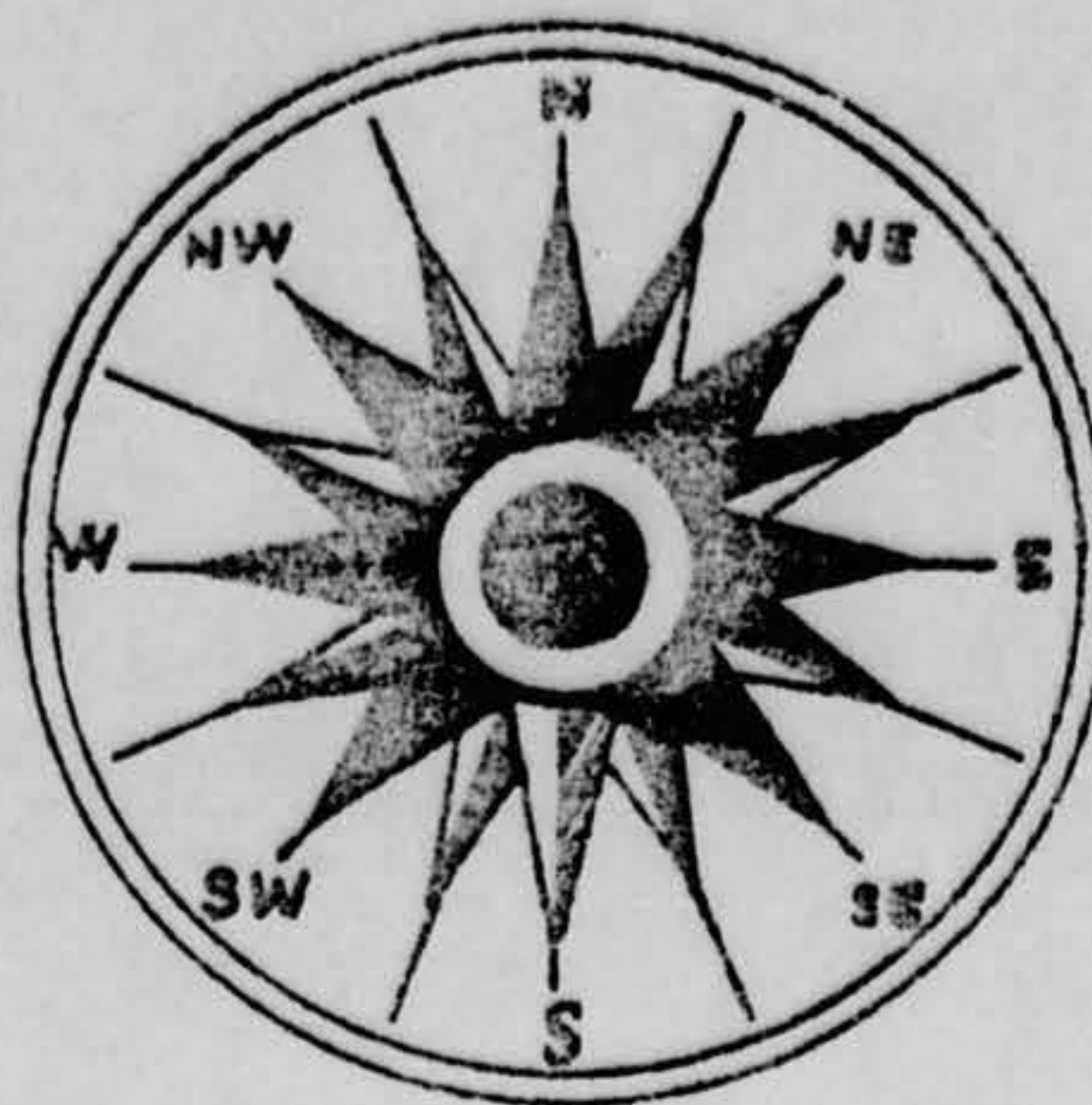
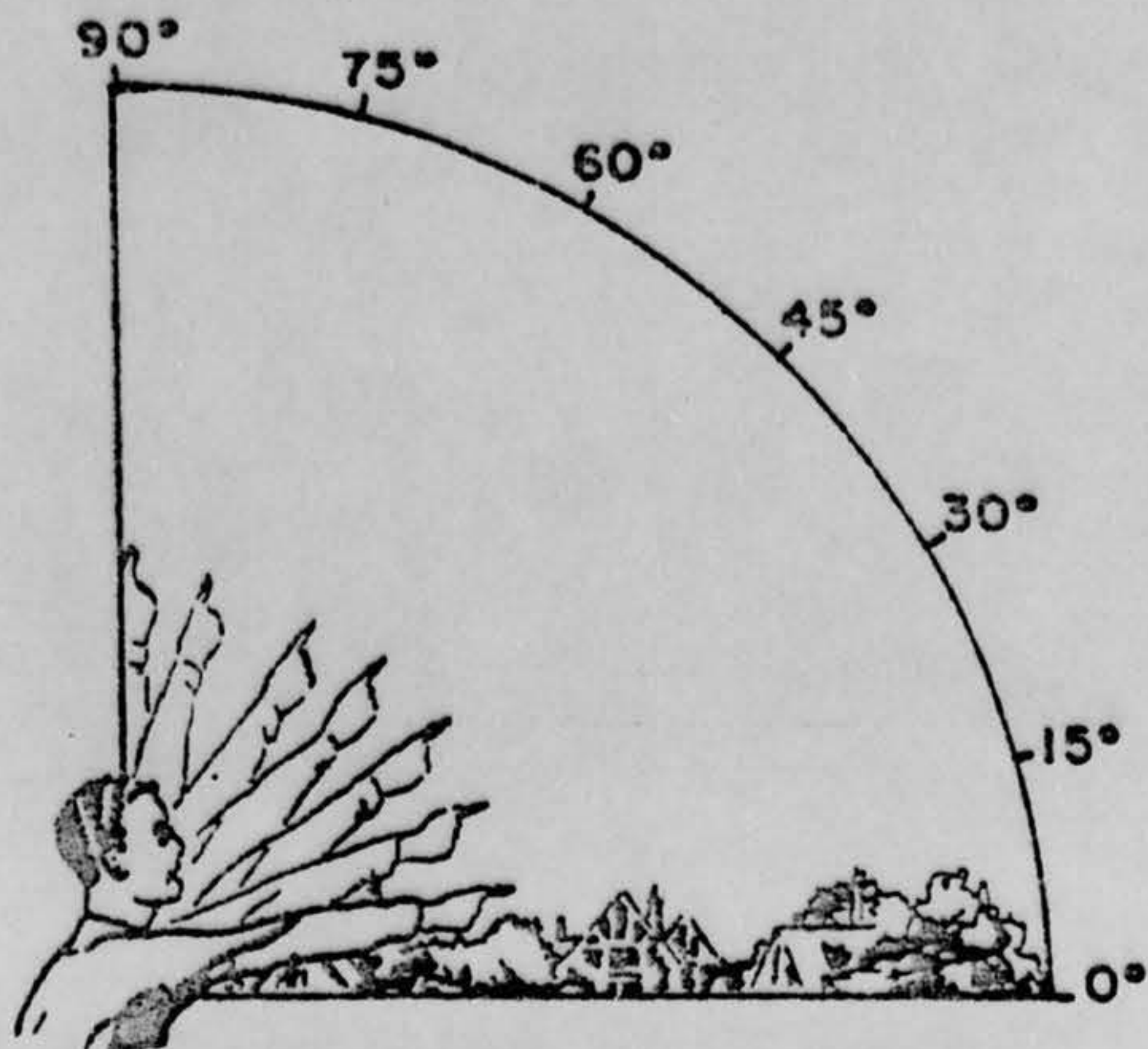

35. Information which you feel pertinent and which is not adequately covered in the specific points of the questionnaire or a narrative explanation of your sighting.

The sighting on July 13 - Showed up as just one bright Red light after watching it, it broke into smaller objects. A smaller light appeared in front of the larger one then another, at this time the large light dimmed down and disappeared. While the two smaller ones was out a third appeared and the first one to appear went away after dimming. Then the fourth one appeared. This went on for about 6 times. Only to be in sight for a few seconds.

on Aug 28, at 0:10. I spotted a bunch of red light that at first made me think that a plane was on fire. I went home and got my Binoculars, but by that time there was nothing in the sky. - This was traveling west $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles away at 00:40 same date this object appeared again following Rt 31 thru the village. I was about 1000 - 1500 ft away from Rt 31 when I spotted this.

There was a Sheriff's car traveling about 30-35 mph thru the village with this object 50 ft north of it and I'd say 5 to 800 ft above it. Before I could pick up the two-way radio and have them check what was above them the lights all went out and they didn't appear again. This object was keeping the same speed as the Sheriff's car and the light stayed on. Three Red on top with three Blue on the bottom space about 20-25 ft apart. This looked like (6) six object as there was no solid thing or outline.
