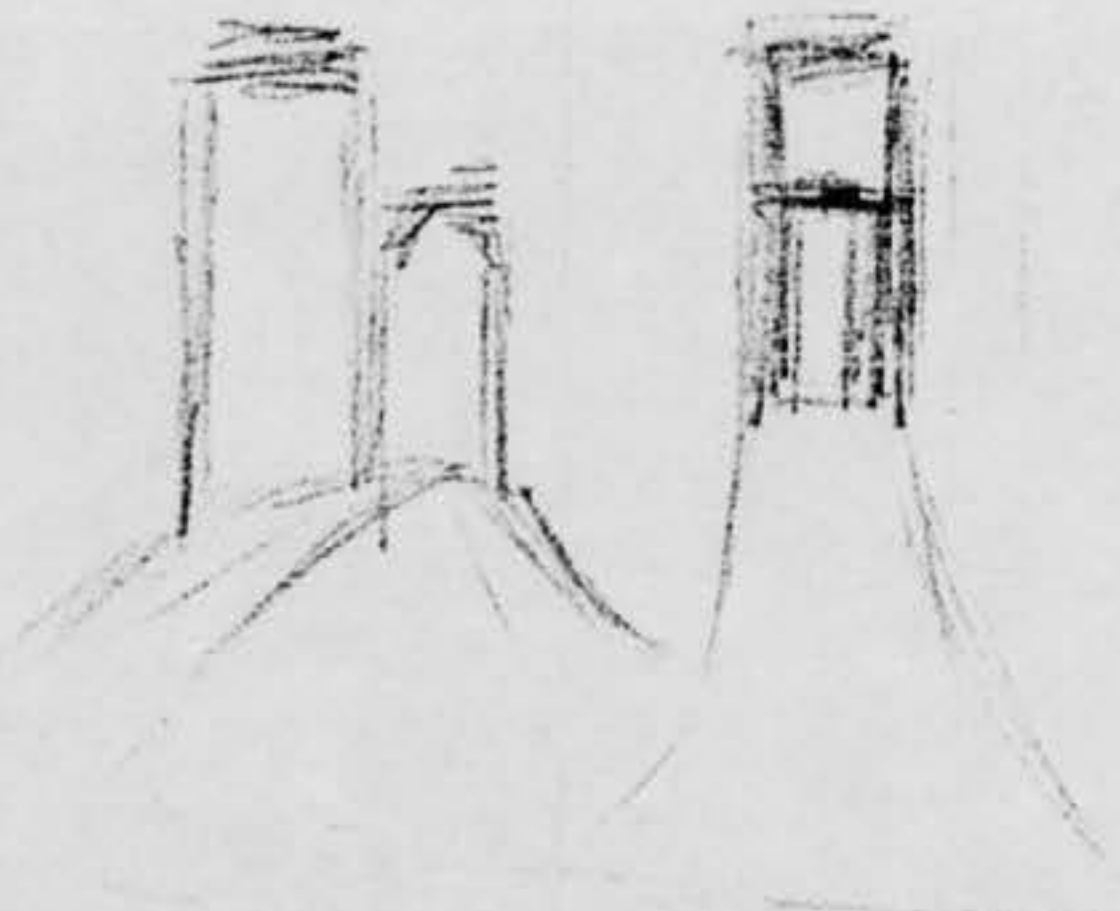

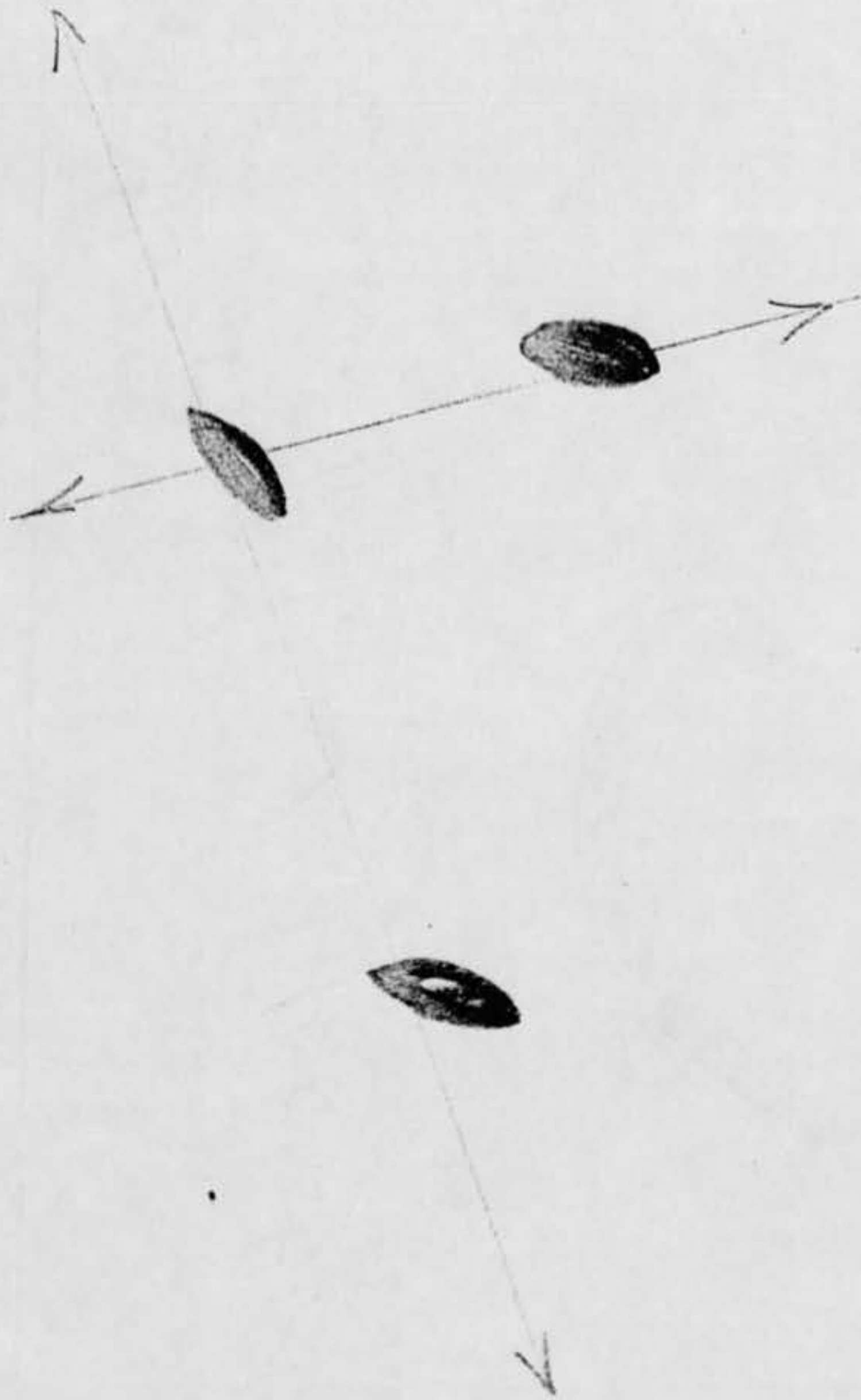

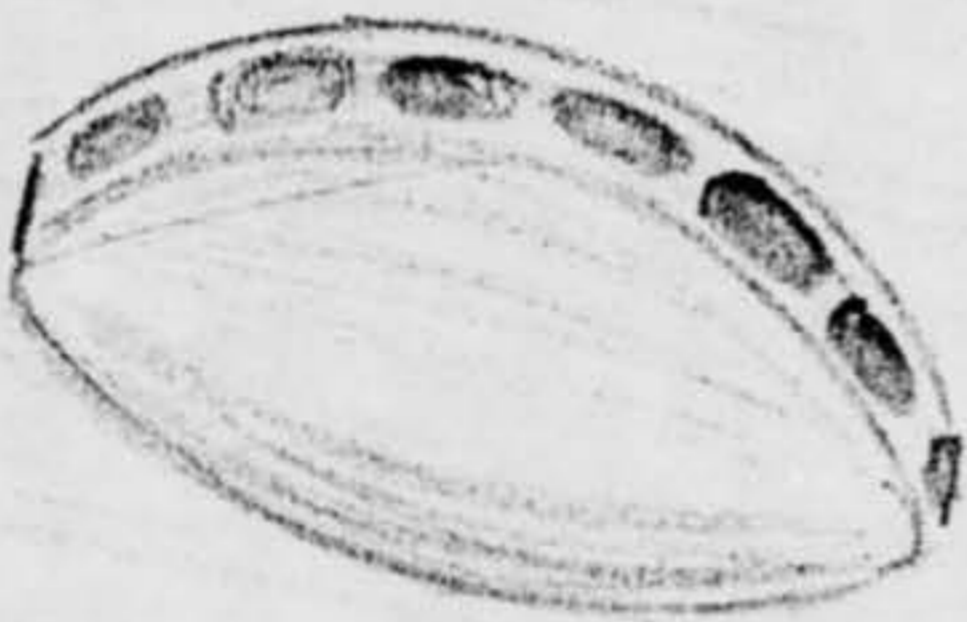

Subj: Photographs, [REDACTED]

Lt Conaway from the Information Office at Suffolk County AFB called Col Quintanilla on 27 August 1968 at 1445 hours. Lt Conaway said he had a UFO report that seemed rather important. He said the problem was that a man inadvertently took a photograph of a UFO while taking pictures of the sunset. The man claims they are valuable photographs and will not send them into the Air Force because they are so valuable and he has had numerous money offers from magazines. He does want somebody from the Air Force to come out and look at them though. Lt Conaway said they did not have anyone there who could go out and look at the photographs. Col Quintanilla informed Lt Conaway that the original negatives would have to be looked at by photogrammetry personnel. Therefore, if the gentleman wishes to have the Air Force look at the photographs he will have to send the original negatives in and also provide the data required in AFR 80-17. Col Quintanilla told Conaway that this man is probably trying to get the Air Force to say that his photographs are authentic. Well all photographs are authentic, but the UFOs aren't. The man who took the photographs is Mr [REDACTED] ^{with} a New York Advertising Agency and is a professional photographer. Col Quintanilla told Lt Conaway that if he speaks with Mr [REDACTED] on the telephone to insure that his secretary is on the telephone to verify the conversation. Lt Conaway will inform the man that the Air Force cannot perform an analysis without the original negatives and that he will be happy to forward the original negatives to the proper personnel in photo analysis.

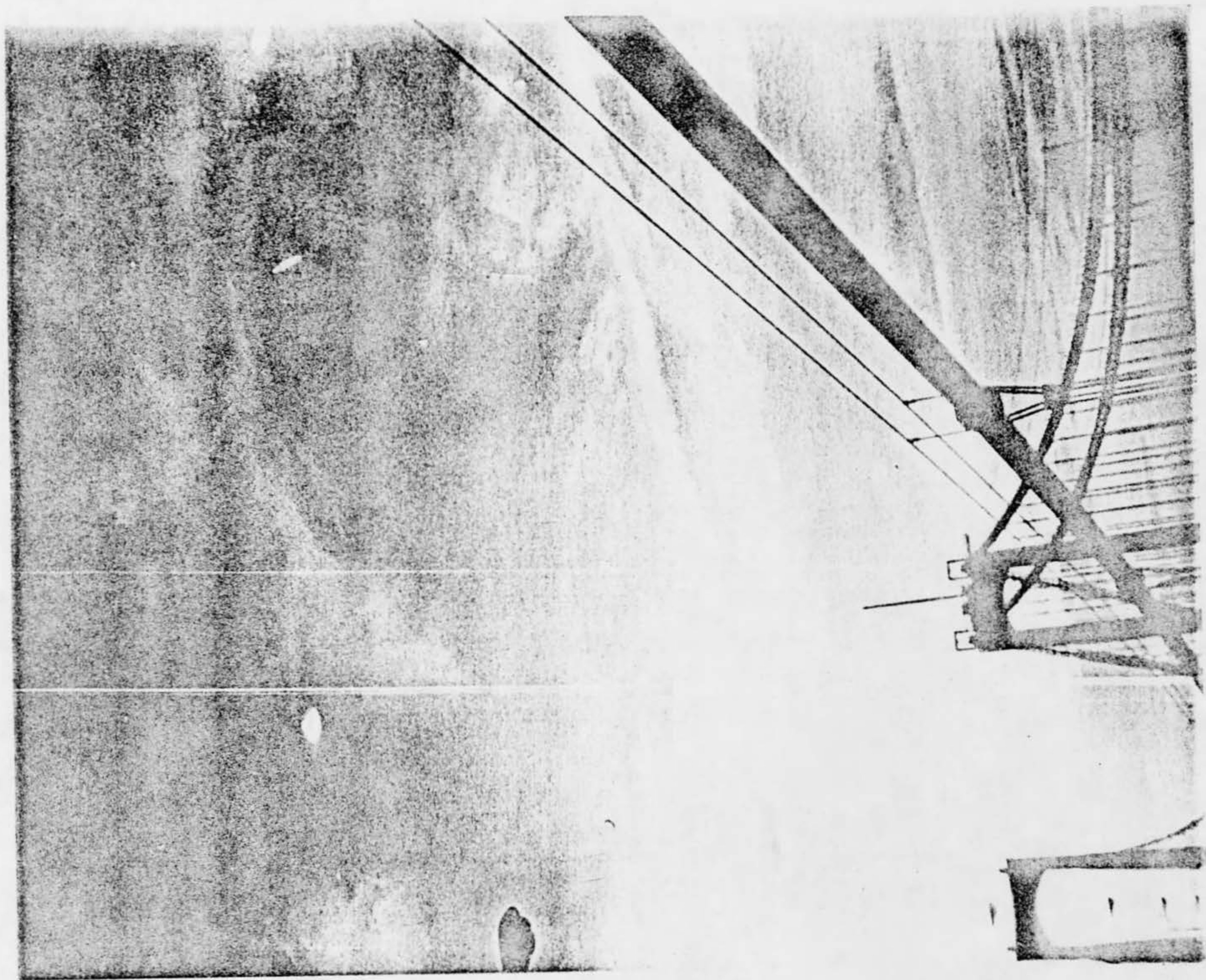
Subj: Photographs taken by Mr ██████████

Mr ██████████, President of the Metro-Market Advertising Agency called Lt Colonel Quintanilla on 28 August 1968 regarding some photographs of unidentified flying objects that he accidentally took. Mr ██████████ informed Col Quintanilla that he had spoken with Lt Conaway at Suffolk County AFB with regards to the photographs. Mr ██████████ said that he and his other professional members had never seen anything quite like this, they are quite extraordinary. Mr ██████████ said he had never been interested in UFOs. He said he had some of his top people study the photographs and knew it wasn't reflections, lens flares, inversions or birds. He said the objects are reflecting off of the sun, they have structural shape. He blew them up to 1ft in diameter with a projection screen. There is a good deal of details, with indentations, they have domes. Mr ██████████ said that since he thought there was no one more familiar with photographs than the Air Force than the Blue Book Office, he wanted to forward them to Wright-Patterson for analysis. Col Quintanilla informed Mr ██████████ that he would turn them over to his photo analysis personnel. Mr ██████████ said he was sending them to Suffolk, Lt Conaway and Lt Conaway was going to send them to Wright-Patterson. Lt Conaway had asked him some questions over the telephone but they weren't very detailed. At the time the photographs were taken they were crossing the Delaware River Bridge to New York, with a night camera he was taking pictures at 1/500 a second. Mr ██████████ wanted to be assured that he would get the full results of the photo analysis if he turned them over to the Air Force. Col Quintanilla informed him that he would receive the full report. He said that there company attorney thought he shouldn't send the original negatives into the Air Force but with Col Quintanilla's assurance that the original transparencies would be returned in the same condition that he forwarded them to the Air

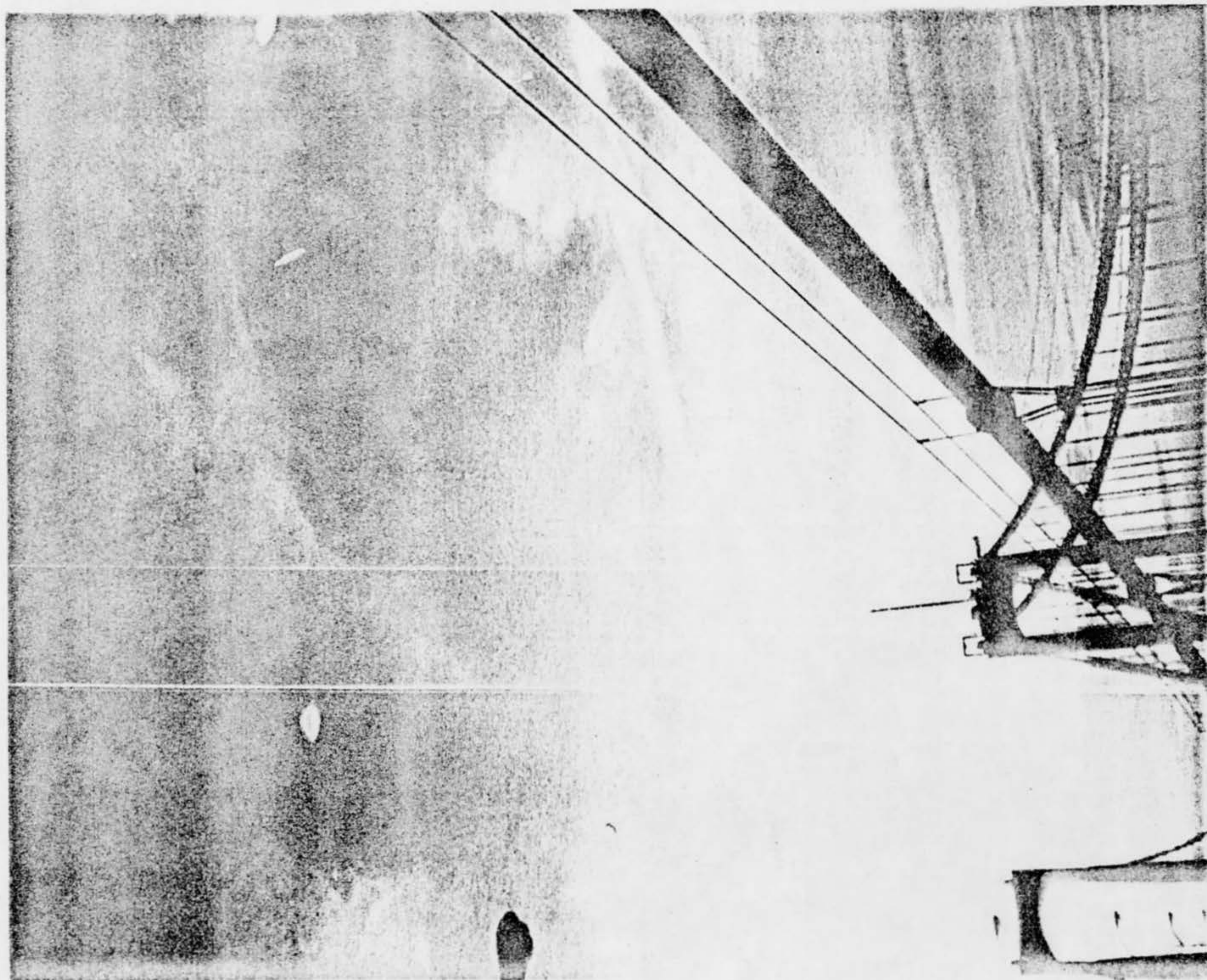
he said he would go ahead and forward them to Lt Conaway. Col Quintanilla told Mr [REDACTED] he could mark the originals in any manner he wished so that he could readily identify them as being the originals, especially since the Air Force has been accused, in the past, of not having returned the originals to observers. Mr [REDACTED] said he would not mark them since he had viewed them many times and was very familiar with the photographs. Mr [REDACTED] tried to stress the fact that they were not quaks but were professional personnel, and are not looking for publicity. Col Quintanilla informed Mr [REDACTED] that the analysis would take 6 to 8 weeks, may be longer, may be shorter. It all depended upon the fact that the photo analyst personnel must work on the Southeast Asia work first. Mr [REDACTED] said this would be okay as long as they had complete access to the analysis that would be accomplished. Mr [REDACTED] then said he wanted to briefly explain the photographs. We were traveling to Washington to take photographs of Resurrection City. In advertising we are always taking photographs and we have a whole roomful of pictures, thus the reason for the camera. Leaving New Jersey Turnpike when I noticed a beautiful sky and the sun was setting into it. I had the camera outside the car window and we were traveling approximately 65 mph. I was simply snapping away. My vision was quite limited since we were in a small sports car. I continued to take pictures while we crossed the bridge. It was not until after the photographs had been developed and we were sitting in the projection room that we saw a series of very bright lights ∇ that were over the bridges. We just stopped and looked at them. There were two here and two there. I have a pilots license and have never seen anything like this before. Then then put the next photo on the screen. This shows the ∇/∇ objects passing over the bridge, and perhaps it is 2 - 300 ft above the bridge. These objects were disc shaped, with dome with indentations. Very clear and they look ~~xxxx~~ metallic. The next photo shows them leaving the bridge, going south, following the ∇ path of the river. I had decreased the lens

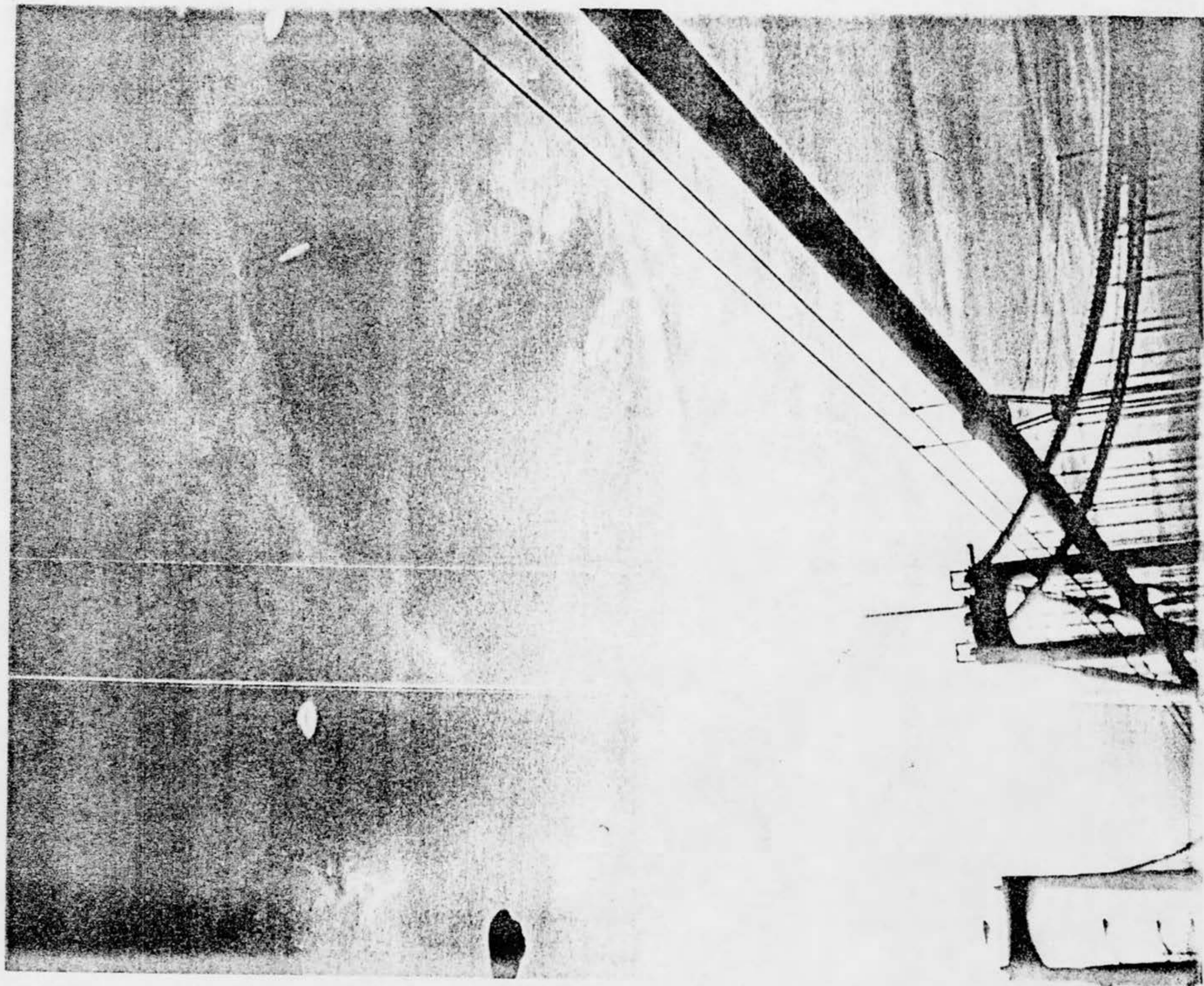
opening, the objects are reflecting the light of the sun. There are three photographs. This is it more or less. There are three photographs, and the first shows the outside of my car/~~the~~ the bridge is about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles in the distance, the next photograph we were on the bridge and the next photograph we have just about left the bridge.
