1. (U) SPECIAL POLITICAL COMMITTEE AGREED WITHOUT VOTE  
8 DECEMBER TO RECOMMEND THE UNGA ADOPT A DECISION  
CALLING FOR "INTERESTED MEMBER STATES" TO CONDUCT  
UFO RESEARCH AND ASKING UN OUTER SPACE  
COMMITTEE TO AFFORD GRENADA AN OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE  
A PRESENTATION OF GRENADA'S VIEWS ON UFO RESEARCH  
WHEN OSCO MEETS IN JUNE 79. FOUR-PARAGRAPH TEXT OF  
CONSENSUS RECOMMENDATION IS IDENTICAL TO THAT  
TRANSMITTED BY DATAFAX IN CONNECTION USUN 5603 AND  
APPEARS PARA 3 THIS TEL. GRENADA PERMREP GRIFFITH  
SPOKE BRIEFLY TO COMMEND THE PROPOSED ACTION. NO  
OTHER DEL TOOK THE FLOOR.

2. (C) MISOFF TOOK OCCASION OF DISCUSSION WITH OSC  
RAPPORTEUR (CAROLOS GARCIA OF BRAZIL) TO SUGGEST THAT  
OSC REPORT CAN EASILY INCORPORATE FACT OF GRENADA  
PRESENTATION IN DRAWING UP ITS ANNUAL REPORT TO THE  
GA IN 79. HE AGREED WITH MISOFF'S REMARK  
THAT MERELY BECAUSE OSC WILL HAVE DISCUSSED THE

3. (U) BEGIN TEXT:

THE SPECIAL POLITICAL COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS TO THE

GENERAL ASSEMBLY ADOPTION OF THE FOLLOWING CONSENSUS:

- THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY HAS TAKEN NOTE OF THE STATEMENTS MADE, AND DRAFT RESOLUTIONS SUBMITTED BY GRENADA AT THE 32ND AND 33RD SESSIONS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY REGARDING UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS AND RELATED PHENOMENA.
- THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY INVITES INTERESTED MEMBER STATES TO TAKE APPROPRIATE STEPS TO CO-ORDINATE ON A NATIONAL LEVEL SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH AND INVESTIGATION INTO EXTRATERRESTRIAL LIFE, INCLUDING UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS, AND TO INFORM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL OF THE OBSERVATIONS, RESEARCH, AND EVALUATION OF SUCH ACTIVITIES.
- THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY REQUESTS THE SECRETARYGENERAL TO TRANSMIT THE STATEMENTS OF THE DELEGATION OF GRENADA AND THE RELEVANT DOCUMENTATION TO THE COMMITTEE ON THE PEACEFUL USES OF OUTER SPACE, SO THAT THEY MAY CONSIDER THEM AT THEIR 1979 MEETING.
- THE COMMITTEE ON THE PEACEFUL USES OF OUTER SPACE WILL PERMIT GRENADA, UPON ITS REQUEST, TO PRESENT THEIR VIEWS TO THE COMMITTEE AT ITS NEXT SESSION. THE COMMITTEE'S DELIBERATION WILL BE INCLUDED IN ITS REPORT

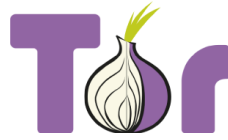

## CONTEXT FROM ORIGINAL DOCUMENT

(p124, p121)

(PUBLIC DOMAIN) - 8 December 1978 — The United Nations votes 33/426 to establish an agency or department of the UN to study UAP, failing to pass the draft resolution. Former Project Blue Book consultants J. Allen Hynek and Jacques Vallee speak to the UN Special Political Committee, which is not interested in the formal study of UAP. Public records on these meetings show no sitting element of the DOD or U.S. intelligence community spoke in support of the resolution, despite the fact that the Air Force, Navy and NORAD are all on record having monitored UAP events over the prior decade.
