

ridicule. He said that he had not and would not report the incident to headquarters—again for fear of ridicule.

(11) Sam and I reported *our* incident to the Warren SAC Command Post right after that call and were laughed at and told to call back if the UFO "ate the cops" we had sent to check it out. Even though we were laughed at each time we called, we made sure that it was officially reported with about 3 or 4 more calls to the Command Post. On the final call we insisted that they include it in their log or we would wake the base commander. I wish we had.

(12) The next morning, after our alert duty ended, Sam and I were relieved by a new launch crew and went topside. Sgt. Jones was there, curled up in a chair. He was wide awake and still quite upset and scared about his experience. We spent some time talking to him and trying to calm him down. After promising that we wouldn't report the SAT team's actions, Sgt. Jones told us that they had been scared to death and had decided that they were not, under any circumstances, going to drive to any missile site that had "the thing" hovering over it. That explained all of their supposed vehicle and equipment problems. I did not see Sgt. Jones again on any other alert duty, which was unusual.

(13) During the next several missile crew departure meetings, all outgoing crews were briefed to the effect that this event never officially happened and were ordered not to talk about it to anyone. I did not recognize the individual who briefed us at those departure meetings.

(14) As a serviceman who followed orders for 20 years I have reservations about mentioning this incident. However, over the past several years, I have read about, or seen discussed on the Larry King TV show, similar ICBM-related UFO incidents which have been reported by former military personnel. One case revealed by a former Minuteman missile commander, Robert Salas, especially comes to mind. Since skeptics have challenged these persons' memories, as well as their integrity, I think it is time for all of us who have had similar experiences, but have been silent about them, to come forward and talk about what we observed.

(15) I have not been paid nor given anything of value to make this statement and it is the truth to the best of my recollection.
