DEAR EDITORS,

For several years I have taken a serious outlook towards aerial phenomena. At first I was quite skeptical, but after studying hundreds of individual cases from all over the world I have come to the logical conclusion that Unidentified Flying Objects, commonly known as Flying Saucers are of extraterrestrial origin. I would like to say that A.P.R.O. has done a magnificent job of seeking out the facts concerning this unnatural phenomenon. As well as being complimentary, my letter is intended to bring to light two sightings made by a friend of mine of UFOs.
